Associate Pastor



With great pleasure, we welcome Fr. Thuan Nguyen to our parish family. Fr. Thuan (as he prefers to be called) comes to us from Our Lady of the Assumption parish, Claremont. He joined the Vietnamese Dominican vocation center at the age of thirteen where he completed studies in philosophy and theology. When the government did not allow his ordination, he escaped his homeland and lived in a refugee camp in Thailand for nearly two years. He eventually settled in Canada and was ordained in 1993.

From 1993 to 1996, he served as associate pastor in three different parishes. After further study in Northern California, he relocated to Most Holy Trinity church in Phoenix, Arizona, a multicultural Dominican parish. Fr. Thuan then served as pastor of Vietnamese Martyrs parish in Phoenix for ten years while also leading the Vietnamese community in the Phoenix diocese before coming to the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.


GUATEMALA DISASTER COLLECTION

On June 3, 2018 devastation struck just 30 miles southwest of Guatemala City when the Volcán de Fuego erupted resulting in approximately 114 deaths, 200 missing persons and close to 3,000 displaced people from destroyed homes. During this time, Guatemala is in solemn need of our prayers and support as they face such devastating loss within their community. We will have a second collection **TODAY** during all masses. Thank you for your generosity.

OBSTACLES

The prophet Ezekiel, Saint Paul, and the Lord Jesus share something in common in today's scripture readings. They all experience obstacles to their ministry. Ezekiel is summoned to prophesy to the Israelites, who are "[h]ard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). Saint Paul recounts how he has been given a "thorn in the flesh" (2 Corinthians 12:7). The Lord Jesus is unable to perform many signs in his native place. The Gospel tells us that "[he] was amazed at their lack of faith" (Mark 6:6). We too sometimes encounter obstacles as we travel along the journey of faith. So often we experience weakness on this journey. Let the words of the Lord to Saint Paul encourage us today: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Last week's Treasure mentioned the "Nuns of the Battlefield," religious sisters from several communities who served as nurses in the Civil War. Florence Nightingale had only instituted female nurses a decade before in the Crimean War, so the idea of women tending to wounded soldiers was extraordinary. The medical and sanitary conditions on the battlefields were appalling, and the sisters were nearly all teachers. Few had any medical training beyond what they had learned as youngsters in the family. Anti-Catholic prejudice was so deeply entrenched in America that sisters could not wear their habits in public. These sisters were the first, and people on both the Union and Confederate sides soon began to marvel at their bravery, efficiency, and respect for Protestant soldiers. More than six hundred sisters from twenty-one communities went to war, serving in wretched conditions. They were tough and single-minded, efficient and fearless.

After the war, sisters could appear in public everywhere in the reunited nation, and often received the praise and gratitude of grateful soldiers and family members on behalf of their sister nurses. An outdoor monument to the "Nuns of the Battlefield" stands in Washington at M Street and Rhode Island Avenue. The inscription reads: "They comforted the dying, nursed the wounded, carried hope to the imprisoned, gave in His name a drink of water to the thirsty."

SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

Go beyond just saying “no” to teach children about polite exceptions

Rules about politeness seem to be in contradiction to the rules we teach children about avoiding predators and responding to behaviors that make them uncomfortable. It's important to expand on the idea of saying “no” when someone asks them to cross a boundary. Explain that there are situations where being rude is acceptable, if that's what it takes, and help them understand that being polite has its limits. DESASTRE EN GUATEMALA
