FEET ON THE GROUND

"Until next week, keep your feet on the ground and keep reaching for the stars!" Not today's scriptural wisdom, but legendary DJ Casey Kase-m's sage advice, heard across America for generations, American Top 40's challenging sign-off. Though Casey wasn't quoting scripture, today's Acts of the Apostles offers similar advice. As Jesus ascended, disciples "were looking intently at the sky." Wouldn't we prefer a soul-relaxing gaze into peaceful blue skies to a heart-breaking focus on this blood-stained earth? But heavenly questioners asked Jesus' first disciples, "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" Earth awaited their mission! While our hearts should "keep reaching for" heaven, we need to "keep our feet on the ground." Ascension's scriptures and the Jubilee of Mercy remind us: the Jesus we revere as "ascended into heaven" lives right here among us on earth, awaiting our recognition and loving service. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The mystery of the Ascension has to do with holding in tension a sense of God's nearness, along with the burden caused by apparent signs of absence. The risen Jesus says to Mary Magdalene, "Do not cling to me," perhaps pointing out to her that his physical presence to the disciples was time-bound and temporary. It was a gift for their transformation, and after forty days, he vanished from their sight and hearing, though never out of their consciousness.

They do not mourn at his going this time: there is no trace of the disciples who hid in fear at his crucifixion, no sense of the women who wept softly as they carried ointments to the tomb through the dewy morning light. Instead, the scriptural accounts show them full of joy, comforted by his promise to be with them forever, and open to the Spirit's power. They are joyful, energized, aware, and united with one another in love. They seem to grasp an awareness that if the mission to the whole world was a serious one, then the presence of the Risen Christ could not be pinned down to any one place or time, but had to be always and everywhere completely available. All peoples, all times, all cultures were opened to receive him in this moment of the Ascension. The energy of this feast is drawn not from absence, but renewed and deeper presence.

SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

Parents can learn a lot about their children, and their children's friends, simply by keeping conversations going whenever possible — after school carpool, snack time, field trips, etc. Pay attention to any conversations that leave you feeling unsettled, and know when it's important for you to speak up. For example, a child's friend may tell you she doesn't like her new history teacher, or he makes her feel uncomfortable. Even if you don't know the teacher personally, it is well worth communicating the concerns the child has to the school. It can be easier to pick up on levels of discomfort or unease in children rather than watching the adult in question. PROTEGIENDO A LOS NIÑOS

Si escucha que sus hijos no se sienten seguros, ¡comuníquelo!

Los padres de familia pueden aprender mucho acerca de sus hijos y los amigos de sus hijos, simplemente manteniendo conversaciones en la medida de lo posible durante viajes compartidos después de la escuela, durante la merienda, excursiones, etc. Ponga atención a cualquier conversación que lo deje con inquietud y sepa cuándo es importante que usted hable. Por ejemplo, la amiga de un niño puede decirle que no le gusta su nuevo profesor de historia, o que él la hace sentir incómoda. Incluso, si no conoce personalmente al maestro, vale la pena comunicar las preocupaciones que la niña tiene a la escuela. Puede ser más fácil detectar niveles de incomodidad o malestar en los niños en lugar de observar al adulto en cuestión.
