## Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist

Wednesday of this week, September 21, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Matthew, one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus Christ and the traditional author of the first Synoptic Gospel. Matthew was a Jew who worked for Romans collecting taxes from other Jews. In spite of his unlikely position, Jesus chose him as one of the foundations of the Church. Reflecting on St. Matthew's calling, Pope Benedict noted how those who seem farthest from holiness can accept God's mercy and show its marvelous effects in their lives.

My Dear Parishioners,  
 I pray that you are doing well and being blessed. I am writing to you to give you an update on our parish. First of all, let say how blessed we are to be able to come together to worship our God. It is always great to see many of you on weekday mornings and on the weekend. As we continue to deal with this pandemic, we are still faced with obstacles and adjustments. Let me assure you that we will continue to follow the guidelines set forth by the archdiocese and by the county department of health. There has been some concern from all over the archdiocese concerning the reception of Holy Communion. Again, it is optional to receive in the hand or on the tongue. I would prefer that if you want to receive on the tongue, that you would come to the priest celebrant and wait until all have received in the hand. Again, this is MY preference, but I will not deny you communion on the tongue if you come up at the regular time. It is your choice. Sadly, many of our parishioners are still staying at home on Sunday so I would ask you who do attend to invite your family members and friends to come back and join us. It is perfectly safe as long as we continue to follow the protocols set forth.

I want to thank you for your support on our recent campaign "Called to Renew". Because of your generosity we were able to not only meet our goal but surpass it as well. We received pledges in the amount of **\$1,312,913.00. WOW!!!**

This means that we get back 100% over our goal of \$1,220,000.00 or \$92,913.00. This will help us tremendously. I ask that you continue to send in your payments so that we can move forward with our projects as soon as possible.

### FEAST OF SAN LORENZO RUIZ

Welcome and celebrate with us the Feast of San Lorenzo Ruiz, the first Filipino Saint, Saturday, September 24, 5:30 p.m. Mass. Dinner to follow immediately in the Parish Hall and Zumba! Please bring your families and friends.

#### San Lorenzo Ruiz

San Lorenzo Ruiz, the first Filipino saint, was a layman, married, with two sons and a daughter. Born in Binondo, Manila, in the early 1600s of a Chinese father and Tagala mother, he was raised a devout Catholic. He worked as a calligrapher for the Dominican parish of Binondo, where he transcribed baptismal, confirmation, and marriage documents. In 1636 Ruiz was implicated in a murder. He sought help from his Dominican superiors who believed in his innocence. In order to escape what they believed would have been an unjust prosecution, the Spanish friars immediately sent Ruiz on a missionary expedition outside of the Philippines. Initially, Ruiz thought he was being sent to Taiwan, where he believed his Chinese roots would enable him to start a new life. Little did he know that he and his fellow missionaries were actually headed for Nagasaki, Japan, where feudalism was fanning the flames of Christian persecution. Ruiz was arrested almost immediately upon his arrival and subjected to intense torture by Japanese captors who tried to convince him to renounce his faith. Ruiz refused, declaring, "I am a Christian and I will remain a Christian even to the point of death. On September 22, 1637, Ruiz and his companions were led up a hill overlooking the bay of Nagasaki to agonizing punishment and death. Ruiz died on September 29, 1637.





### SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

#### How to respond to choking, part two

Babies under the age of one are at a risk of choking but handling a blocked airway in such a young child requires a different approach. If the baby cannot cough, cry, or breathe, support him “face down” by holding the head in one hand with the torso on your forearm, against your thigh. Give up to five back thumps between the shoulder blades with the heel of your other hand. If this does not work, roll the infant face up and provide five chest thrusts, about 1 ½ inches deep, with two fingers on the breastbone, just below the nipple line. ### SJW MEMORIAL SOCIETY

St. Joseph the Worker Memorial Society is intended as a meaningful and beautiful way for persons to remember their beloved deceased or to express their condolences to friends who have lost a loved one. Persons enrolled in the Memorial Society will share in the spiritual benefits of special Masses and prayers offered throughout the year, every year. A Mass is offered for those enrolled every first Saturday of the month at our 8:30 a.m. Mass. The enrollment list is kept in the Parish Center and is accessible during office hours. Each memorial is presented in a handsome leatherette folder, containing an enrollment card where the name of the person remembered is inscribed, along with the person who enrolled the deceased. The leatherette folder with personalized enrollment card is particularly suitable on the occasion of a death, to bring to a viewing or funeral, or to send as an anniversary remembrance. ### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

When the Roman Empire turned a favorable eye toward the once-persecuted Christians, among the effects was a population explosion in the baptismal font, as Christian sympathizers stepped from the shadows. With more and more people becoming Christians, laws were passed to protect Sunday as a work-free day. Soon, it became possible to celebrate Mass later in the morning, rather than the older custom of gathering before dawn to celebrate Eucharist. Amazingly, despite the increasing numbers of Christians, there was great resistance to adding to the number of worship events; the Eucharist that began as a few friends around a table soon was transformed into a more formal event with throngs crowding a large hall. All the Christians in a city or town would gather around the bishop for the one Sunday Eucharist, and only when the crowds became unmanageable was there an impulse to divide the assembly by splitting off a new bishop and flock. Now, sixteen hundred years later, many parishes see a need to trim or combine Mass schedules. This is often seen as tough surgery. Yet our forebears in the faith would see it as a gain: a filling up of the Eucharist with a large and vigorous assembly, a fullness of ministry, an opportunity to make the Church more fully visible and stronger for service. —James Field, *Copy-right* © J. ## PROTEGIENDO A LOS NIÑOS

### Cómo responder a la asfixia, segunda parte

Los bebés menores de un año corren el riesgo de asfixiarse, pero el manejo de una vía respiratoria bloqueada en un niño tan pequeño requiere abordarlo en una forma distinta. Si el bebé no puede toser, llorar o respirar, sosténgalo "boca abajo" tomando su cabeza con una mano con el torso sobre su antebrazo, contra su muslo. Dé hasta cinco golpes en la espalda entre los omóplatos con la base de la otra mano. Si esto no funciona, ponga al bebé boca arriba y dele cinco compresiones en el pecho, de aproximadamente 1 pulgada y media de profundidad, con dos dedos en el esternón, justo debajo de la línea de los pezones.
