

GUIDELINES FOR FAST & ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

Abstinence is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from the consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. Pastors and parents are encouraged to see that those who are not bound by the obligation to abstain are held to appreciate an authentic sense of penance.

Fasting- In addition to abstinence, fasting is to be observed by all Catholics between the ages of 18-59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

RCIA

My Friends in Christ,

We began Lent on Ash Wednesday, some of our catechumens and candidates, the people that are dismissed and leave mass every Sunday after the homily, are now ready to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. We have discerned with them and have determined some of them are ready. On the first Sunday of Lent we celebrate a Rite of Sending. Last Sunday at the 9:30 a.m. mass we celebrated that rite. The purpose of the rite is to <u>SEND</u> those Catechumens and Candidates that will be receiving the Sacraments of Initiation this coming Easter season to Archbishop Jose Gomez. There, they will celebrate the Rite of Election or the Rite of Call to Continuing Conversion. These celebrations take place at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels; last Sunday was the Rite of Election for the unbaptized and on Sunday, March 23 will be the Rite of Call to Continuing Conversion for the baptized.

At the Rite of Sending that took place here at the 9:30 a.m. mass last Sunday; we, as a community, heard from the sponsors and godparents on the readiness of these catechumens and candidates to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This community approved and sent them to Archbishop Gomez. They signed the Book of the Elect, received their gray gowns and were dismissed with all the rest of the catechumens and candidates as we do each Sunday. After the Rite of Election our Catechumens will now be called our "Elect." They will appear on the screens before and after mass, they will also be in the bulletin.

Next Sunday at the 9:30 a.m. mass we will be celebrating the First Scrutiny and presentation of the Creed. The Scrutiny is to unmask the deception of evil and sin for what they really are: thieves of true and authentic life. It is also to welcome the loving presence of God, bringing light and encouraging full life. The focus of the Scrutiny is toward life, freedom and salvation. We also present the Creed to these Elect because it is an ancient and revered text of the Church recalling the wonderful deeds of God for the salvation of the human race. It fills the vision of the Elect with the sure light of faith.

Keep an eye on this space; it will be bringing you information about the RCIA process here at St. Joseph the Worker. I will be telling you when we will be celebrating rites and rituals and give information about those that are in the Order of the Catechumens. I hope these celebrations add to your sense of community and your spiritual experience. Please pray for our Elect, Catechumens and Candidates as they prepare to celebrate the rites called for in the RCIA during the coming weeks. Bill Sparks

Manteniendo en privado la información personal de sus hijos

Si sus hijos dan su información personal por medio de Internet, no sólo es fácil conseguir los datos, sino que es muy difícil borrarlos totalmente. Recuérdele a sus hijos la importancia de mantener privado sus datos e información personal. Cerciórese de que tengan un nombre de usuario y una contraseña que no revele información personal y que no den su dirección del correo electrónico a cualquier persona. TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Muchos católicos aprovechan el tiempo de Cuaresma para confesarse. El sacramento de Reconciliación tiene una historia un poco complicada, pues ha sufrido muchos cambios con el transcurrir de los siglos. Al principio, la penitencia sólo se celebraba una sola vez en la vida de un cristiano y era necesaria en caso de pecado grave, como lo era la apostasía, el adulterio y el asesinato. El penitente tenía que hacer una confesión en público, frente al obispo y la comunidad entera. La penitencia consistía de un ayuno severo y vestir una indumentaria especial que lo distinguía. Esta penitencia podía durar semanas, y a veces, meses. Durante este tiempo, el penitente no podía estar presente en la mesa de la Eucaristía hasta que el obispo le diera la bendición de reconciliación, la cual, a menudo, se llevaba a cabo el Jueves Santo. Con el paso del tiempo, los cristianos se dieron cuenta de la necesidad de celebrar el sacramento de la Reconciliación con más frecuencia y por otras clases de pecado. Algún tiempo después, esta práctica cayó en el desuso y fue sustituida por la confesión privada, la cual se originó entre los monjes irlandeses. Después, esta práctica fue aceptada por toda la Iglesia. De esta manera es que nació el sacramento de la reconciliación que conocemos hoy. PARISH REGISTRATION


