PASSION

The word "passion" connotes deep, focused engagement. It also relates to passivity, interestingly. The deeply passionate person in the Gospel narrative from Luke is Jesus. He appears passive, but he is not. He is wholly self-possessed and wholly present for the one day that begins on Thursday evening at his last meal with his apostles and ends with his burial before sunset the next day. Then follows the long Sabbath silence.

The narrative of the Passion is read whole and without pause on the Palm Sunday of the Passion. This story, found in each of the Gospels, is unchanging. We are the ones who change. Each year, we bring ourselves with another year's history to hear and heed the story we so badly need. Life has its way with us, and we look again to the Passion narratives to learn to follow.

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TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

What day is today? Ask most folks strolling home from church today and they will reply "Palm Sunday." Not too long ago, today was known as the "Second Sunday of the Passion," and in 1970 it was renamed "Passion Sunday." This made some sense, since the procession recalling Christ's entry into Jerusalem is usually only celebrated once in a parish on this day, but the Passion is proclaimed solemnly at every liturgy. In its most recent incarnation, the name for this day includes both aspects of the celebration: "Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord." In the United States today, most worshipers are provided with palm branches, although in northern Europe pussy willows are favored, and in Italy olive branches are the norm. When our calendar was reformed, the entire structure of the week to come was revised even as the traditional name, "Holy Week," was retained. The major benefit of the restructuring of our calendar is to help us see that the Triduum, the great three days beginning at sunset this Thursday and extending until sunset on Easter Sunday, is at the heart of the Christian life. Today, as you ponder the Lord's Passion, you may consider your response to so great a gift. Centuries ago, good Christians vowed to go on pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Today, at least once in your lifetime, promise to participate faithfully in the liturgies. Now begins the Church's annual baptismal retreat: don't be left out!—Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN**Not all predators fit a mold**

Many people mistakenly believe that predators fit into a mold, and that by teaching children to avoid those kinds of people, they will be safe. Another common belief is that an abuser or predator would most likely be a stranger, or a mean and scary person. Not all situations follow this pattern. Parents should focus on teaching their children how to handle uncomfortable situations, by getting away immediately and going to a trusted adult. Parents should also keep watch for signs of abuse or distress in their children. 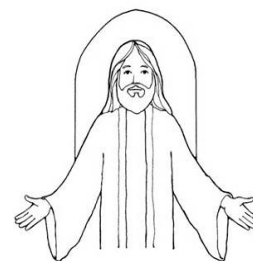

RCIA

Holy Week begins, the holiest week of the year for Catholics all over the world. Our focus in this week is the Passion of Christ. We will begin this holy week quietly in prayer, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Holy Thursday begins the Triduum these are the three days during which Christ suffered, was crucified, buried and rose on the third day. It starts as Jesus celebrates the Passover meal (The Last Supper) with his disciples and the events of that Passover. We hear how Jesus taught his disciples through his actions. It tells us, today's disciples, that by reenacting his actions we follow his teachings, it recalls in our day the saving reality of those events. That is why the foundational stories in the gospel are so important; in them are embedded the deep meanings that are behind the ritual we celebrate. The meanings contained in these stories are self-emptying service for others, redemptive identification with the lowly as a "suffering servant," and discipleship as willingness to share the mission and ministry of Jesus. These teachings we bring to our catechumens and candidates during our RCIA sessions, preparing them to for mission and service.

At the Holy Thursday Mass, the "Mass of the Lord's Supper," we see Jesus serve his disciples by washing their feet. He teaches that to lead is to be of service to all. During mass we receive the oils that have been blessed at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels at the Chrism Mass on the Monday of Holy Week. These oils are used for all the celebrations that require anointing in our parish. After Holy Thursday mass, the church is emptied of everything to await "the Great Celebration," Easter when it will be replenished and filled with great celebrations. Good Friday, the most solemn day in our Catholic calendar; there is no mass anywhere on that day in the whole world. Here we only have a prayer service. This service is in three parts, the Liturgy of the Word, Veneration of the Cross and Communion. Holy Saturday, we pray as we wait in anticipation of the "Great Celebration", Easter.

For our Elect and Candidates, Holy Saturday is a very full day. Beginning in the morning with a retreat; they spend the morning in prayer and reflection with their godparents and sponsors in preparation to receive sacraments. Then an early afternoon rehearsal with the Elect for the coming evening's celebration; Mass starts at 7:30pm with the lighting of the Pascal Candle. It is the time they have been preparing for and the culmination of their journey to initiation. It is the opening of the door to the beginning of their Catholic life; a great time for them and for us. We welcome our Elect into our parish community at the Vigil Mass with Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Holy Saturday is a long day for all, but it goes by in the wink of an eye; it is full of meaning and emotion for all. Come; celebrate with us as we celebrate Easter.

As Easter season continues, we welcome our Candidates at Sunday mass during the Easter Season. Join in on those celebrations too and celebrate with them. Easter is a great time and I look forward to celebrating it with you.

I remind you again to pray for our Elect and Candidates during this Holy Week. They are appearing on the screens in the church, please pray especially for them.

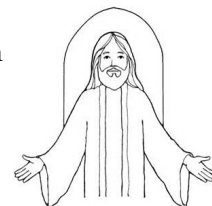
