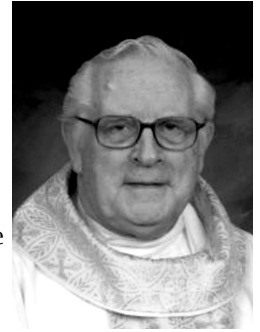

FORMER PASTOR CALLED HOME TO OUR LORD

Rev. Msgr. James Loughnane, 1937-2018

Early last Tuesday morning, our parish received the sad news of the passing of Rev. Msgr. James J. Loughnane, P.A. Msgr. Loughnane was the second pastor at St. Joseph the Worker, serving here from 1981 to 1993. A native of County Galway, Ireland, he was ordained at All Hallows Seminary, Dublin, in June 1961. Six weeks later he arrived in the Los Angeles Archdiocese, where he served as associate pastor at several parishes before coming to Winnetka.



The years under Msgr. Loughnane's leadership were a time of growth and pastoral development. He brought the Renew program to our parish; initiated a youth program and children's choir; introduced RCIA, Bible Study, Contemplative Prayer, and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Finance and Liturgy committees were formed. Mass in Spanish was introduced in 1982. In 1983 the Vietnamese Community was invited to celebrate liturgy every Sunday in their native language.

Msgr. Loughnane was named pastor of St. Denis parish, Diamond Bar, in 1993, where he remained pastor, beyond normal retirement age, until his death. Concurrently, he served on several archdiocesan councils and boards. In addition, he was Episcopal Vicar for the San Gabriel Pastoral Region from 2012 to 2015. In November 2005, Pope Benedict XVI honored Msgr. Loughnane with the personal title of Protonotary Apostolic (P.A.), in recognition of outstanding service and commitment to the Church and the Holy Father.

Let us give thanks for the gift of Msgr. Loughnane, a priest-leader who served Jesus, the Church, and our Archdiocese for fifty-seven years. He died on September 17, 2018, at the age of eighty-one.

HOW DO WE TREAT THE MESSENGER?

Let's not be too hasty in defining who is "the wicked one" and who (namely us) is just! We are very quick to label others as evil, because we tend to label ourselves as good guys. We don't like it when we are brought up short by a prophetic voice that brings us some bad news about our own behavior. We don't like to be reproached for transgressions of the law or charged with violations of our training.

We may condemn and abuse those who bring us up against these truths about ourselves when, if we were really good, we would thank them for helping to keep us on the right path. FROM THE FRONT COVER

SAN LORENZO RUIZ, THE FIRST FILIPINO SAINT

Lorenzo Ruiz was a layman, married, with two sons and a daughter. Born in Binondo, Manila, in the early 1600s of a Chinese father and Tagala mother, he was raised a devout Catholic. He worked as a calligrapher for the Dominican parish of Binondo, where he transcribed baptismal, confirmation, and marriage documents.

In 1636 Ruiz was implicated in a murder. He sought help from his Dominican superiors who believed in his innocence. In order to escape what they believed would have been an unjust prosecution, the Spanish friars immediately sent Ruiz on a missionary expedition outside of the Philippines. Initially, Ruiz thought he was being sent to Taiwan, where he believed his Chinese roots would enable him to start a new life. Little did he know that he and his fellow missionaries were actually headed for Nagasaki, Japan, where feudalism was fanning the flames of Christian persecution.

Ruiz was arrested almost immediately upon his arrival in Japan and subjected to intense torture by Japanese captors who tried to convince him to renounce his faith. Ruiz refused, declaring, "I am a Christian and I will remain a Christian even to the point of death." On September 22, 1637, Ruiz and his companions were led up a hill overlooking the bay of Nagasaki to agonizing punishment and death. Ruiz died on September 29, 1637. He was canonized at the Vatican on October 18, 1987. His feast day is September 28.

Adopt-a-Knight Scholarship Fund

Many families in our community require financial assistance to enable their child to attend our parish school. The Adopt-a-Knight Fund has been established to aid students who cannot afford the complete cost of a Catholic education.
