LISTEN TO JESUS AND THE PROPHETS

Prophets have always had a tough row to hoe. Their words, often unwelcome, are used against them to persecute and even kill them. Such was the fate of the Old Testament prophets, and Jeremiah is a great example of this. Jesus endured opposition from sinners, and did not turn back from a shameful death in order to rise to a glorious new life. The ultimate prophet, Jesus sought to warn the people of his time and ours of the divisions that his words would cause, showing himself to be the prophet of all time. We all need to look at our divisions and dilemmas in light of Jesus' teachings and warnings, and seek to understand all that he has proclaimed and taught about what will happen if we fail to listen.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In recent weeks, we have reviewed how the Churches of East and West have enriched one another, and this past Thursday's solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary was born in the Eastern Church. It is a gift from the ancient Church of Jerusalem, a commemoration of the death of Mary, and a feast charged with a deep sense of the Resurrection. Mary, the first disciple, is the first to share fully in Christ's victory over death. In the tradition of the East, August 15 is the "Dormition of the Theotokos," or the "Falling Asleep of the God-bearer." There is no shadow of death or gloom in the theology, since this is seen as a transformation of Mary's life into a heavenly and immortal existence. There is a sense in the tradition that she who made earth heavenly and exalted the human race by her faithfulness is glorified today.

A persistent legend among Orthodox Christians tells how all the disciples, except Thomas, who was preaching in India, were present at Mary's death and burial, and sat by the tomb for three days. On the third day, Thomas saw Mary's body rising to heaven. She greeted him as "my friend," and he was escorted by angels to proclaim her assumption to the others, who then realized her tomb was empty. Thus Thomas, the one who expressed doubt at the resurrection of Christ, received a gift from Mary: the chance to proclaim resurrection faith to the disciples.

SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

Don't let a predator use fear to manipulate a child

Many victims of abuse don't report the abuse right away, if ever. Predators groom their victims, and part of this process is designed to make the victim feel like they should trust their predator, even more so than their own parents. Many victims also have a fear that their parents or trusted adults won't believe them, or that they will get in trouble for what happened — sometimes an abuser will threaten a child, using the child's fear to buy the child's silence. It's important for parents to teach their children to talk with their parents about what is happening to them, what might be frightening them, and that they will be supported in disclosing. 


FROM THE FRONT COVER

Our Lady Of La Vang Celebration

St. Joseph the Worker commemorates the anniversary of the Vietnamese Community in our parish with a celebration of Our Lady of La Vang. The observance coincides annually with the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To begin the celebration, parishioners and visitors, many in traditional dress, process into the church for the Sunday 4:00 p.m. Mass, with the statue of Our Lady of La Vang, beautifully decorated with multicolored flowers. Members of the community's ministries participate in this very special liturgy. A dinner reception with music and entertainment takes place in the Conference Center Hall after Mass. Everyone is invited to this parish celebration.

About Our Lady of La Vang

Our Lady of La Vang Shrine, located approximately 40 miles north of Hue, the former capital of Vietnam, is an important faith symbol for Vietnamese Catholics. It is believed that Mary first appeared to the Vietnamese people at this site in 1798, during a time of intense persecution of Vietnamese Catholics and missionaries. Many sought refuge in the deep forest of La Vang, where they battled bitter cold, jungle sickness, and starvation. As they gathered one night in prayer, they were visited by an apparition of a beautiful lady in a long cape, holding a child in her arms, with two angels at her sides. The people recognized the lady as Our Blessed Mother, who comforted them and assured them that their prayers would be heard and answered. The Blessed Mother continued to appear at the same site throughout this period of religious persecution. After the persecution had officially ended, a church was built in honor of the Lady of La Vang and inaugurated in August 1901. In 1928 a larger church was built to accommodate the increasing number of pilgrims. In April 1961 the holy church of La Vang became the National Sacred Marian Center, and in August 1962 Pope John XXIII elevated the church of La Vang to the Basilica of La Vang. Destroyed in the summer of 1972 during the Vietnam War, the church has since been rebuilt and remains an important pilgrimage site and symbol of faith and devotion for the Vietnamese people.

No permita que un depredador use el miedo para manipular a un niño

Muchas víctimas de abuso no denuncian el abuso de inmediato, si es que alguna vez lo hacen. Los depredadores preparan a sus víctimas, y parte de este proceso está diseñado para que la víctima sienta que debe confiar en su depredador, incluso más que en sus propios padres. Muchas víctimas también temen que sus padres o adultos de confianza no les crean, o que se metan en problemas por lo que sucedió; a veces un abusador amenaza a un niño, utilizando el miedo del niño para comprar el silencio de éste. Es importante que los padres de familia enseñen a sus hijos a hablar con ellos sobre lo que les está sucediendo, lo que podría estar asustándolos y que recibirán apoyo al compartir esa experiencia. 
