SAINTS AND ALL HALLOWS' EVE

Later this week ghosts and goblins, costumes and horror movies will mark our celebration of Halloween. The origins of Halloween date to the ancient Celts, for whom November 1 marked the beginning of a new year and the coming of winter. Celts believed that on the night before the new year, the boundary between the worlds of the living and the dead became blurred. On the night of October 31 they celebrated Samhain, when it was believed that the ghosts of the dead returned to earth. In 835, Pope Gregory IV moved the celebration for all the martyrs (later all saints) from May 13 to November 1 as a time to honor all saints. Soon, All Saints Day incorporated some of the traditions of Samhain. The evening before was known as All Hallows' Eve, and later Halloween.

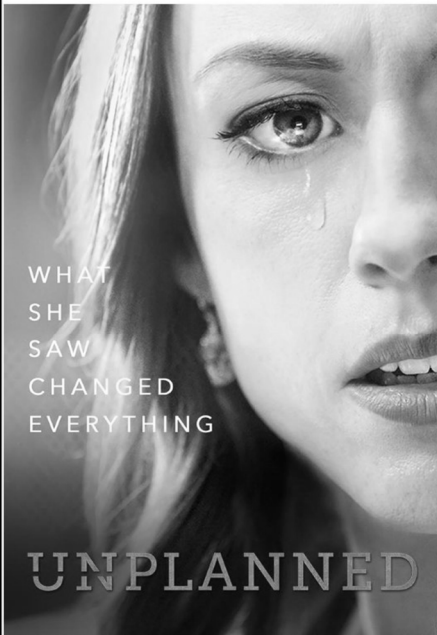
