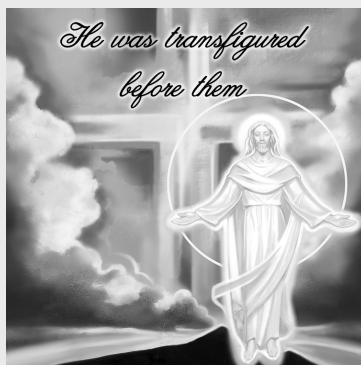

**PARISH LIFE****AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM FR. BETO**

During the cold and flu season and the current situation with the COVID-19 outbreak we remind you to use common sense. Those who are ill are NOT obligated to attend Mass and should STAY AT HOME to recover out of concern for your fellow parishioners and for your speedy recovery. We also ask that at mass you refrain from offering your hand to others at the sign of peace. No one should feel obligated to offer a handshake at the sign of peace for fear of becoming ill. This is the most common way the flu and cold is transmitted. A smile, a nod of the head and a heartfelt "Peace be with you" should suffice. Even a wave of the hand is an acceptable gesture along with "Peace be with you".

We have asked those who are ill to please refrain from receiving from the cup, but unfortunately, some continue to do so. For the safety of all, we will be suspend offering communion from the chalice temporarily. Remember, that if you receive under the species of bread only, you are in fact receiving the body AND blood of our Lord.

At the Lord's Prayer, the Church has long asked us to raise our hands in the "Oran's" position. Holding hands during the Lord's prayer is not only unwise, it is not the teaching of the Church.

I hope these measures do not cause you any disturbance, but they are necessary given our current situation.

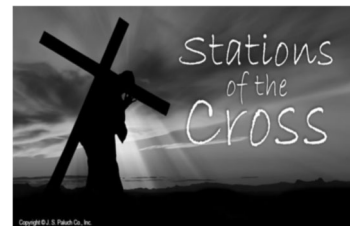

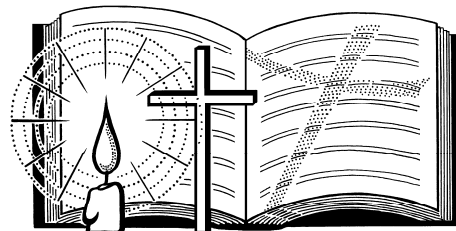

Pero para los niños pequeños y para los adolescentes que no son expertos navegando el internet, los chats pueden ser muy buenos lugares para que los depredadores sientan las bases de sus acciones. En una sala de chat cualquiera puede adoptar una personalidad distinta a la verdadera, y los depredadores se hacen pasar por amigos. Platiqué con sus hijos sobre las reglas de seguridad en línea, como por ejemplo nunca ponerse de acuerdo para conocer a alguien en persona, y nunca proveer su información personal y su información de identificación. Revise los chats frecuentemente para asegurar que su hijo/a está participando en una conversación segura. Nadie debería sentirse obligado a ofrecer un apretón de manos ante el signo de la paz por temor a enfermarse. Esta es la forma más común de transmisión de la gripe y el resfriado. Una sonrisa, un movimiento de cabeza y un sincero "La paz sea contigo" debería ser suficiente. Incluso un movimiento de la mano es un gesto aceptable junto con decir "La paz sea contigo".

Les hemos pedido a aquellos que están enfermos que se abstengan de recibir el caliz, pero desafortunadamente, algunos continúan haciéndolo. Por la seguridad de todos, estaremos suspendiendo temporalmente la comunión del cáliz. Recuerden que si reciben solo bajo la especie de pan, de hecho están recibiendo el Cuerpo Y la Sangre de nuestro Señor.

Durante el "Padre Nuestro", la Iglesia nos ha pedido durante mucho tiempo que levantemos nuestras manos en la posición de "Oran's". Tomarse de la mano durante la oración del Señor no solo es imprudente, no es la enseñanza de la Iglesia.

Espero que estas medidas no les causen molestias, pero son necesarias dada nuestra situación actual.

VIA CRUCIS | STATIONS OF THE CROSS

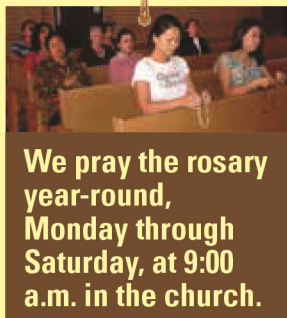
