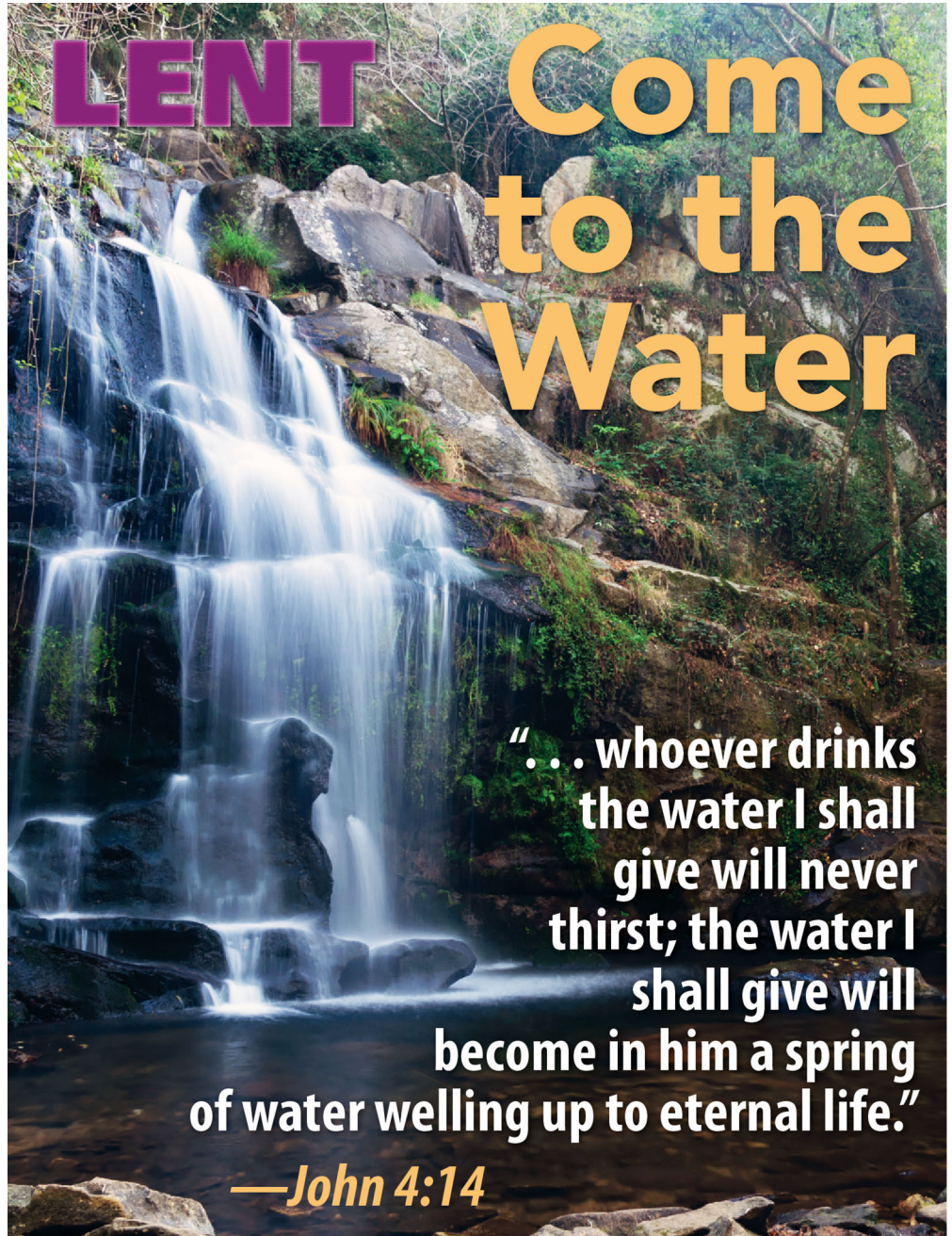

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM FR. BETO

During the cold and flu season and the current situation with the COVID-19 outbreak we remind you to use common sense. Those who are ill are NOT obligated to attend Mass and should STAY AT HOME to recover out of concern for your fellow parishioners and for your speedy recovery. We also ask that at mass you refrain from offering your hand to others at the sign of peace. No one should feel obligated to offer a handshake at the sign of peace for fear of becoming ill. This is the most common way the flu and cold is transmitted. A smile, a nod of the head and a heartfelt "Peace be with you" should suffice. Even a wave of the hand is an acceptable gesture along with "Peace be with you".

We have asked those who are ill to please refrain from receiving from the cup, but unfortunately, some continue to do so. For the safety of all, we will be suspend offering communion from the chalice temporarily. Remember, that if you receive under the species of bread only, you are in fact receiving the body AND blood of our Lord.

At the Lord's Prayer, the Church has long asked us to raise our hands in the "Oran's" position. Holding hands during the Lord's prayer is not only unwise, it is not the teaching of the Church.

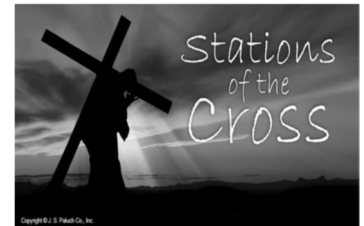
I hope these measures do not cause you any disturbance, but they are necessary given our current situation.

The catechumens we sent to Archbishop Gomez, a couple of Sundays ago to celebrate the Rite of Election were impressed by the ceremony and the numbers of catechumens that were there. We had a group of nine catechumens attending this year. These catechumens are now referred to as “ELECT”. The Cathedral was, as usual, full to capacity with catechumens, godparents, team members and family from all over the archdiocese. It is an impressive site to see the cathedral filled with thousands of people that are going to be baptized this coming Easter. Then to realize that there are two services with those same numbers of “Catechumens” preparing for sacraments of initiation this coming Easter. For our newly Elect and the Candidates, Lent is the period of “Purification and Enlightenment;” this is a time of more intense preparation. During this time we celebrate the Scrutinies with our Elect during mass. The Scrutinies are for them to do self-searching and repentance, to uncover and to heal their weaknesses and sinfulness and to understand and work on that. Also to strengthen all that is good and upright within themselves. The first Scrutiny with our Elect took place today during the 9:30am mass, it will be during the 11:30am next week and again at the 9:30 am Mass on March 29. Our baptized candidates celebrated the Rite of Call to Continuing Conversion at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels last Sunday. In this case they are still called “Candidates.” They are already part of the church with us because they are baptized. We support them in their quest for full initiation and their desire to be in full communion with the church. Things are changing for these Elect and Candidates and so they should continue to change for us all, in our daily journey of conversion to Christ. We pray for our Elect and Candidates that they will find strength in the resurrection of our Lord; that they may find forgiveness within their lives. We the Church, the people of God, are called to support our Elect and Candidates through our prayer and example. Please make a commitment to pray for our Elect and Candidates as they journey through this time of Purification and Enlightenment. They are appearing on the screens in the church. Please pray for all especially in this Lenten season.

PROTEGIENDO A LOS NIÑOS

Esté consciente de los peligros de envenenamiento en el hogar

Más del 90 por ciento de los envenenamientos ocurren en el hogar. Los padres de familia deben saber cuáles son los mayores riesgos que corren los niños (¡especialmente los niños que ponen objetos en su boca!) y trabajar para erradicarlos. El primero en la lista es el envenenamiento por plomo, especialmente en las casas antiguas donde se ha usado pintura o polvos a base de plomo. Las baterías de botones (redondas y planas) son pequeñas y brillantes, muy usadas en muchos juguetes y aparatos electrónicos regados por la casa. Tragarse una de estas puede ser fatal para los niños. Lo mismo ocurre con los líquidos limpiadores que se usan en la casa, como los detergentes empaquetados en pequeñas burbujas de plástico que se usan para lavar la ropa o los platos. MENSAJE IMPORTANTE DEL PADRE BETO

Durante esta temporada de resfriados y gripe y la situación actual con el brote de COVID-19, les recordamos que usen el sentido común. Los que están enfermos NO están obligados a asistir a misa y deben QUEDARSE EN CASA para no preocupar a los demás feligreses y por su pronta recuperación. También les pedimos que en la misa se abstengan de ofrecer la mano a otros en señal de paz. Nadie debería sentirse obligado a ofrecer un apretón de manos ante el signo de la paz por temor a enfermarse. Esta es la forma más común de transmisión de la gripe y el resfriado. Una sonrisa, un movimiento de cabeza y un sincero "La paz sea contigo" debería ser suficiente. Incluso un movimiento de la mano es un gesto aceptable junto con decir "La paz sea contigo".

Les hemos pedido a aquellos que están enfermos que se abstengan de recibir el caliz, pero desafortunadamente, algunos continúan haciéndolo. Por la seguridad de todos, estaremos suspendiendo temporalmente la comunión del cáliz.
