PARISH LIFE**A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

My Dear Parishioners,

I pray that you are doing well and keeping the faith. I want to write to you today to let you know that I am praying for all of you every day so that God can give us all patience, compassion and understanding during this difficult time. This pandemic has really created difficulties in our lives and has called for us to adjust our daily routines. I understand the frustration, but we must not lose hope or trust in God. We don't know when this will end, but in the meantime, like David who felt oppressed, we can echo his beautiful prayer in Psalm 17:6-9,

"I call upon you; answer me, O God. Turn your ear to me; hear my speech. Show your wonderful mercy, you who deliver with your right arm those who seek refuge from their foes. Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me in the shadow of your wings from the wicked who despoil me."

While we trust in God, there are some things we can do to help stop the spread of this virus. God gives us tools and knowledge to be used wisely. Please continue to follow the guidelines of the Archdiocese and the L.A. County Health Dept. I know it can be confusing but let us not forget that this is something new and we are learning as we confront this pandemic.

I ask that if you are feeling any symptoms such as fever, coughing, sore throat, headache, etc. that you stay at home rather than coming to mass where you will have close contact with others. Close contact includes anyone within 6 feet of an infected person for a total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period or being sneezed or coughed on.

At mass, you probably will sit closer than 6 feet to someone for more than 15 minutes. If it turns out you test positive for Covid, you would have exposed them as well. Let us work together. Let's not let this pandemic divide us as a community of faith. We need to respect each person's conscience when it comes to getting vaccinated or not. We will come through this pandemic, and we will be united in prayer. We are sisters and brothers, and we need to support each other. Jesus said in John 17:11

"And now I will no longer be in the world, but they are in the world, while I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are."

God bless you, keep you and may His face shine upon you.

GOD'S LAW

Scripture has always held God's law to be the path to human happiness. In today's first reading, Ezra the priest reads the scroll of the law to the people returned from exile. They weep—then are joyful. Israel's relationship with God had always been defined by how they kept and lived God's law. The author of Psalm 96 likewise praises the law of God as the source of wisdom, joy and enlightenment, purity and justice. In his advice to the bickering Corinthians, Paul points out that, just as God has made all parts of a human body essential for the health of the whole, living as "Christ's body" requires that each member be recognized as necessary for the good of all. Finally, in Luke's Gospel Jesus claims that the Spirit is sending him to relieve human suffering. Like Ezra, he is reading from a scroll, proclaiming God's "law" of mercy to those in need.

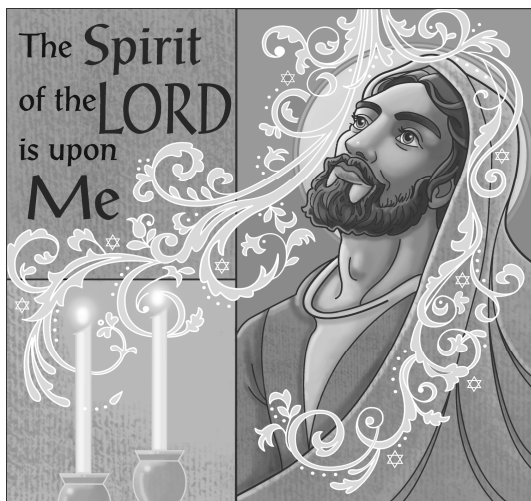

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

"Ordinary" is not always a desirable adjective. Who would not be insulted to receive a thank-you note for your "ordinary birthday gift," or "the ordinary hospitality at the dinner party"? No restaurant advertises its "ordinariness," no car dealer seats a customer at the steering wheel and whispers, "Look how ordinary it is!" Yet here we are in "Ordinary Time." The word carries a different meaning here: it does not mean these days are dull, boring, pedestrian, uninteresting. It means "ordinal," or "numbered" Sundays, a season of the year when we follow the story of Jesus' life and ministry in an ordered way, with each Sunday assigned an ordinal number.

You can amaze your friends with this example of Catholic arithmetic: the "Ordinary Sundays" begin with the last Sunday of Christmas, the Baptism of the Lord, continue until the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, and resume after a cluster of feasts following Pentecost Sunday. The numbers are calculated by counting backwards from the Solemnity of Christ the King, the Thirty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Now you know there is nothing "ordinary" about "Ordinary Time!"

Applicants must meet the following qualifications:

- Student must have a registration date after 7/1/21.
- Student can be in grades Kindergarten through 8th Grade.
- Student cannot have been enrolled in an LA Archdiocese Catholic School during the Spring Semester of the 20-21 School Year.
- If students were previously enrolled in a Catholic School they should be at least 1 semester removed from the LA Catholic School system.
- Exceptions can be made if student was previously at another Catholic school that is not within a 20-mile radius of your school or if their previous catholic school has been closed.
- Student's family income must not exceed the New Enrollment Initiative: Shea Tuition Award (STA) Income Guidelines. (See below)

CEF defines a household as all individuals living together in the same dwelling who share expenses for rent, utilities, food, clothing, and other necessities. Talk to your teenagers about Instagram

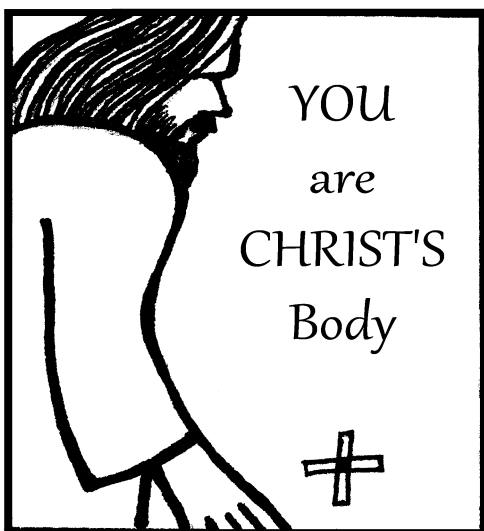

Use age and activity limits or monitoring to keep tabs on how your teens are using Instagram and other social media sites. MENSAJE DEL PARROCO

Mis queridos feligreses,

Le pido a Dios que se encuentren bien y manteniéndose en la fe. Quiero escribirles para hacerles saber que estoy orando por todos ustedes todos los días para que Dios nos conceda paciencia, compasión y comprensión durante esta etapa difícil. Esta pandemia realmente ha creado dificultades en nuestras vidas y nos ha llamado a ajustar nuestras rutinas diarias. Entiendo la frustración, pero no debemos perder la esperanza ni la confianza en Dios. No sabemos cuándo terminará esto, pero mientras tanto, como David que se sintió oprimido, podemos hacer eco de su hermosa oración en el Salmo 17:6-9,

"Dios, mío, yo te invoco porque tú me respondes; ¡Inclina a mí tu oído, y escucha mis palabras! Tú, que salvas de sus perseguidores los que buscan tu protección, ¡dame una muestra de tu gran misericordia! ¡Cuidame como a la niña de tus ojos! Escóndeme bajo la sombra de tus alas. No dejes que me vean mis malvados enemigos, los opresores que quieren quitarme la vida."

Somos hermanas y hermanos, y necesitamos apoyarnos unos a otros. Jesús dijo en Juan 17:11
