Before I formed you
in the womb I knew you,
before you were born
I dedicated you,
a prophet to the nations
I appointed you.

Jeremiah 1:5

The opening of the reading selected from Jeremiah is surely one of the most comforting in scripture. Imagine! God knew me before my bodily conception; God dedicated me before my birth or any human dedication rites; God appointed me a prophet! Then comes the uh-oh. Jeremiah is warned that his appointment as a prophet will bring opposition, against which God's prophets must stand up. Somehow the appointment as God's prophet seems like it should be a bit happier, with the glamor that we might think will come from having friends in high places. Yet, just as there are many forces in the world arrayed against the divine will and divine goodness, so too are they arrayed against God's prophets. A second round of assurances comes to Jeremiah, a pledge that God will be with Jeremiah to strengthen him. God doesn't promise a turmoil-free life, but does vow to be Jeremiah's strength.

JESUS, SON OF JEREMIAH

In the synagogue at Nazareth, a similar turn of events takes place. When Jesus speaks of the Spirit's anointing being upon

him, the anointing described in Isaiah, the crowd is amazed, and seems like they even want to take credit, since he's a local boy. Then Jesus speaks some words of tough love, and "local boy" pivots to "who does he think he is?" You couldn't blame Jesus, in that moment, if he recalled the words of Jeremiah, his prophetic ancestor. Though the crowd drove Jesus out of town and up a hill to throw him to his death, his time had not yet come. The strength and protection that God promises to prophets came for Jesus that day, as he passed through the mob's midst, unharmed. He passed through their midst to continue the work for which the Spirit had anointed him. For us who follow the prophetic heritage of Jesus this day, we've been warned. But we've also been assured of God's care.

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TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The feast of the Presentation is a day for the blessing of candles. Why does liturgy require candles? In the first years of the church, worship was often at night, and candles and torches were carried from place to place within the worship space as needed. Candles were also a mark of festivity and hospitality when people gathered for prayer in homes, and later on in large buildings with thick walls and dark corners. But even after gaslight and electricity, candles were kept. Part of the reason has to do with the warm, clean light of a candle's flame. Candles are a good sign of the partnership of God and creation: wax made by bees, gathered and fashioned by human hands into something beautiful and useful. In order for the light to shine, the candle surrenders itself, almost as if it is pouring itself out so that the light can flood into the world. The candle of baptism, placed into our hands, and carried again and again, speaks silently of that same wisdom. If you would save your life, you must lose it. You must pour your life out like Christ so that you may be filled with the light of his love.

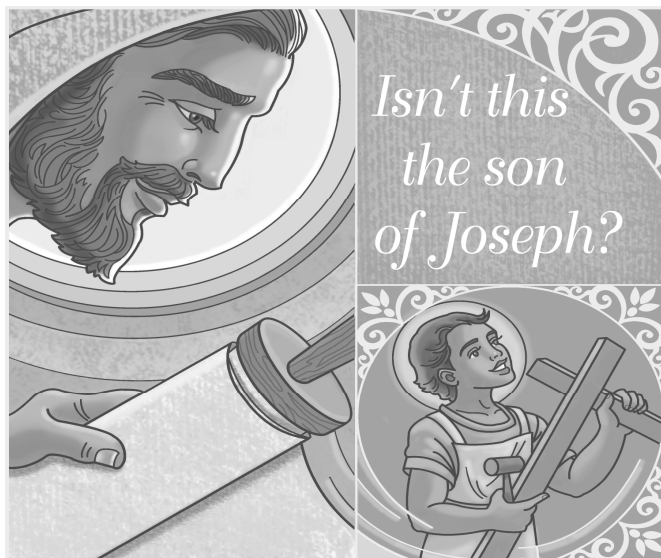

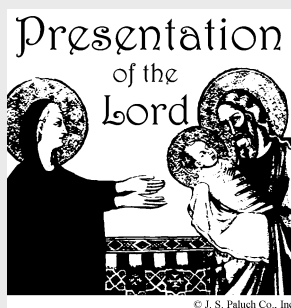

**Adopt-a-Knight Scholarship Fund**

Many families in our community require financial assistance to enable their child to attend our parish school. The Adopt-a-Knight Fund has been established to aid students who cannot afford the complete cost of a Catholic education.

Adopt-a-Knight Scholarships

Awards are based on a family's financial need and the student's citizenship and academic merit. Each family must pay at least half the almost \$5,000 (per child) tuition. Despite the family's financial sacrifice, there is still a substantial gap in the funding needed to cover the annual tuition.

\$2,500 Gift: Provides approximately 100% of the funding gap

\$1,875 Gift: Provides approximately 75% of the funding gap

\$625 Gift: Provides approximately 25% of the funding gap

\$500 Gift: Provides help to cover the cost of uniforms and essential supplies

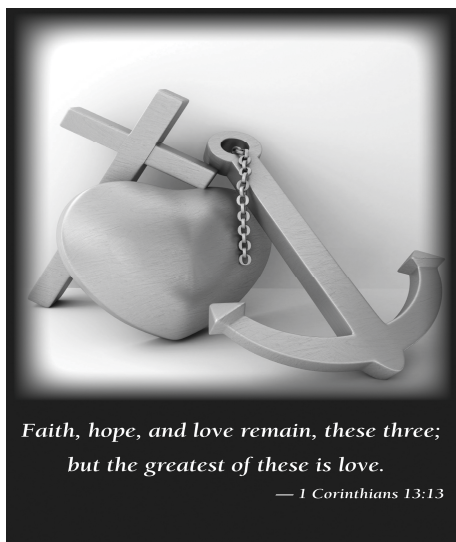

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TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El día 3 de Febrero se celebra entre misas, mariachis, fuegos artificiales y muchas expresiones de religiosidad popular, la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Concepción de Suyapa en Honduras. Fue un sábado del mes de febrero, cuando Alejandro Colindres, un joven humilde labrador, y Jorge Martínez, un niño de ocho años, la encontraron. Según la tradición estos llegaron cansados a la quebrada del Piligüín. Acostándose sobre el suelo, Alejandro sintió lo que le parecía una piedra en su espalda. Por más que intentaba arrojarla lejos, cuando se acostaba sentía la misma piedra. Por fin en lugar de tirarla, la puso en su mochila y al amanecer descubrió que no era piedra sino una pequeña imagen de María (6.5 cm.) con rostro indígena tallada en madera. En 1780 se le construyó un templo y en 1796 se registró su primer milagro. El Papa Pío XII la proclamó Patrona de la República de Honduras en 1925. En las advocaciones latinoamericanas ella es nombrada como la fortaleza de los humildes. —Fray Gilberto Cavazos-Gluz, OFM, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Desde antes de formarte en el seno materno, te conozco; desde antes de que nacieras, te consagré como profeta para las naciones.

Jeremías 1:5

La apertura de la lectura seleccionada de Jeremías es seguramente una de las más reconfortantes de la Escritura. Imaginate. Dios me conoció antes de mi concepción corporal; Dios me dedicó antes de mi nacimiento o de cualquier rito de dedicación humana; ¡Dios me nombró profeta! Luego viene el uh-oh. A Jeremías se le advierte que su nombramiento como profeta traerá oposición, contra la cual los profetas de Dios deben levantarse. De alguna manera, el nombramiento como profeta de Dios parece que debería ser un poco más feliz, como el glamur que podríamos pensar que vendrá de tener amigos en las altas esferas. Sin embargo, al igual que hay muchas fuerzas en el mundo que se oponen a la voluntad y la bondad divinas, también se oponen a los profetas de Dios. Una segunda ronda de garantías llega a Jeremías, una promesa de que Dios estará con Jeremías para fortalecerlo. Dios no le promete una vida libre de turbulencias, pero sí promete ser la fuerza de Jeremías.

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JESÚS, HIJO DE JEREMÍAS

En la sinagoga de Nazaret se produce un giro similar. Cuando Jesús habla de la unción del Espíritu sobre él, la unción descrita en Isaías, la multitud se asombra, y parece que incluso quiere atribuirse el mérito, ya que es un chico del pueblo. Entonces Jesús dice unas palabras de amor duro, y el "chico local" pivota a "¿quién se cree que es?" No se podría culpar a Jesús, en ese momento, si recordara las palabras de Jeremías, su antepasado profético. Aunque la multitud expulsó a Jesús de la ciudad y lo subió a una colina para arrojarlo a la muerte, aún no había llegado su hora. La fuerza y la protección que Dios promete a los profetas le llegó a Jesús ese día, cuando pasó por en medio de la multitud, ileso. Pasó en medio de ellos para continuar la obra para la que el Espíritu le había ungido. Para nosotros, que seguimos la herencia profética de Jesús en este día, hemos sido advertidos. Pero también se nos ha asegurado el cuidado de Dios.
