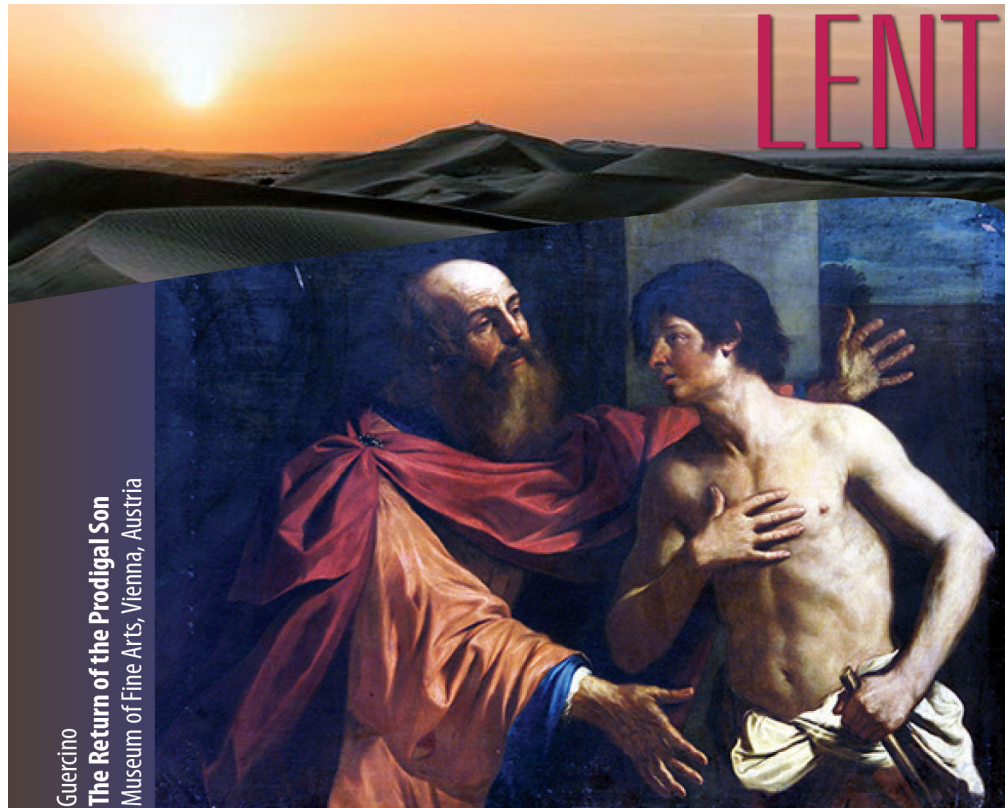

RCIA

My Dear Friends in Christ,

We began Lent on Ash Wednesday, this is the beginning of the period of Purification and Enlightenment. We have discerned with the catechumens and candidates and have determined that some of them have changed their lives to follow Jesus Christ and are ready for sacraments. During this period we celebrate a number of rites. It starts with the Rite of Sending and Enrollment of Names. These two were celebrated on the first Sunday of Lent. The ones that we determined are ready to receive sacraments are enrolling their names as a commitment to follow Christ. Then we, the parish of St. Joseph the Worker, are sending them to our Archbishop to be recognized as being elected by God to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. This is called the Rite of Election and it is when we change how we refer to them, they are now called the "Elect." We continue with the rites of this period. These are the Scrutiny's and the Presentations. Three Scrutiny's are celebrated on the last three Sundays of Lent. You will see them at one of our masses. The scrutiny's are for searching to uncover all that is weak, defective and sinful in the hearts of the Elect; and to bring out all that is strong, upright and good in themselves. The scrutiny's are celebrated to deliver our Elect from the powers of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ. These rites are meant to complete their conversion and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to love God above all. We will also celebrate the presentations, the presentations are the presentation of the "Creed" and the "Lord's Prayer," these ancient texts that have always been regarded as expressing the heart of the Church's faith and prayer. The Church lovingly entrusts these sacred texts to the Elect as they complete their initiation. You are asked to participate in these rites. How? By praying in silence during the scrutiny. Keep an eye on this space, it will be bringing you information about the RCIA process here at St. Joseph the Worker. I will be telling you when we will be celebrating rites and rituals and give information about those that are in the Order of the Catechumens here at St. Joseph the Worker. My hope for us all is that these celebrations add to our sense of community and to be a spiritual experience for us all. Please pray for our Elect, Catechumens and Candidates as they prepare to celebrate the rites called for in the RCIA during the coming weeks. Last Sunday we celebrated the First Scrutiny at the 10:30 a.m. mass. March 27 will be the Second Scrutiny at the 9:00 a.m. mass and on April 3 we will celebrate the Third Scrutiny at the 12:00 p.m. mass. I look forward to your participation in these rites.

May God bless you as we journey through this Lenten Season.
