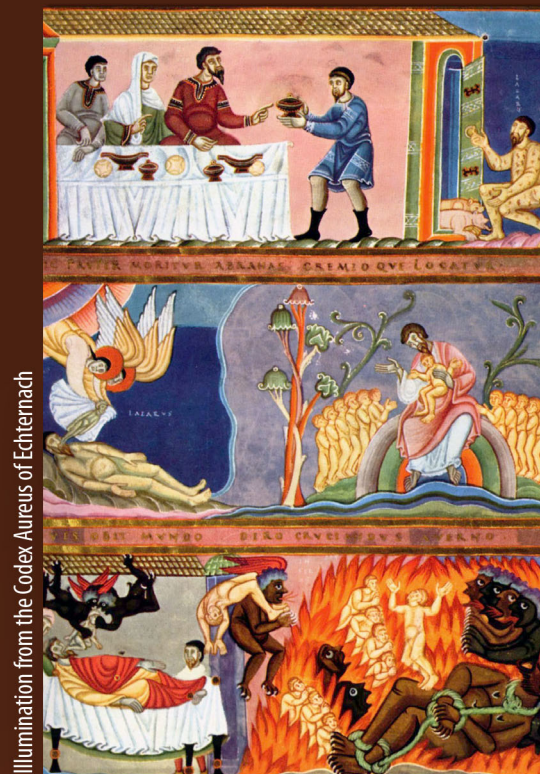

In today's Gospel we hear the parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man. Its vivid details made this one of the stories most frequently illustrated and one that has raised the most discussion about its interpretation. Literally it is a story of afterlife. But, like all other parable of Jesus, looking at it as an allegory figurative in nature, it is a call

for all believers to use their treasure for God and the good of others rather than for being "clothed in purple and fine linen, and fare sumptuously every day" (Lk 16:19) while the beggar Lazarus lays full of sores, wishing to be fed the crumbs for the dogs.

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

CREMATION AND THE TEACHINGS OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

When a loved one goes on to be with the Lord, many decisions need to be made regarding the care and burial of the body. While most families opt to have a traditional funeral, others prefer to have their loved ones cremated. This is perfectly acceptable. It seems more families are opting for cremation so there are concerns that need to be addressed. It is my hope that this will answer most of the questions we receive about cremation.

While cremation is now permitted, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the **body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites**, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in its rites. The body may then be taken to the crematorium. If cremation has already taken place, the remains **may be present at the funeral mass**.

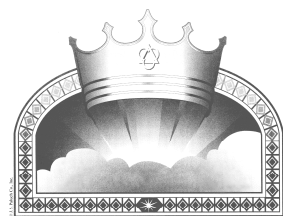
The cremated remains of a body should be treated with same respect given to the corporeal remains of a human body. This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. Now what do we do with the cremains?

Cremated remains should be buried in a grave, entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium or even buried at sea. The practice of scattering cremated remains on the sea, from the air, or on the ground or keeping cremated remains in the home are **NOT** reverent disposition that the Church requires when cremation is chosen. This includes having some of the ashes put in capsules to be worn as jewelry.

If your family opts for cremation, please keep these guidelines in mind as you plan for the funeral rites of your loved ones. Of course, if you have any questions, we are here to help you. You and your chosen mortuary will contact our church office to set a date for the funeral mass as well as burial of your loved ones.

God bless you all, especially if you are facing this difficult situation.

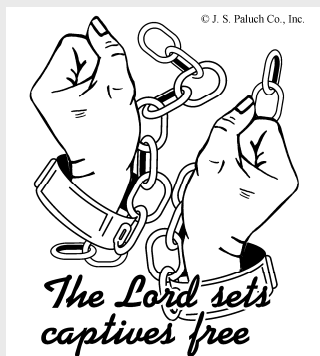

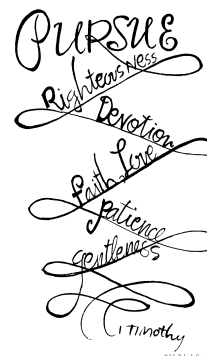

SJW MEMORIAL SOCIETY

A Mass is offered for those enrolled every first Saturday of the month at our 8:30 a.m. Mass. The enrollment list is kept in the Parish Center and is accessible during office hours. Each memorial is presented in a handsome leatherette folder, containing an enrollment card where the name of the person remembered is inscribed, along with the person who enrolled the deceased. The leatherette folder with personalized enrollment card is particularly suitable on the occasion of a death, to bring to a viewing or funeral, or to send as an anniversary remembrance. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Did you ever notice how often the angels are referred to during Mass? We commonly meet them in the Confiteor ("I ask blessed Mary, every virgin, all the angels and saints"), prefaces ("with angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven"), the Roman Canon ("we pray that your angel may take this sacrifice"), and Eucharistic Prayer IV ("countless hosts of angels stand before you to do your will"). Last week and this week angels abound as we celebrated Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael yesterday and will honor the Guardian Angels on October 2.

September 29 was originally the feast day for Michael alone. Gabriel and Raphael joined him in the 1969 reform of the Church calendar. The celebration of the Guardian Angels has been observed since the sixteenth century in Spain. Pope Clement X assigned the feast to the first free day after St. Michael's in 1670, and there it has remained. Take some time this week to reflect on these, God's messengers and our protectors, and maybe even celebrate with a little angel food cake!

Padres ayudando a padres

Algunos padres de familia parecen tener dificultades, o simplemente no entienden del todo la importancia de llegar a tiempo a la escuela o de recoger a sus hijos al final de una práctica deportiva. Es importante encontrar formas de involucrar a los padres de familia en estas responsabilidades importantes desde el principio. Una forma de iniciar el proceso es invitándolos a reunirse para hablar sobre posibles problemas y hacer una lluvia de ideas sobre directivas y soluciones. REQUISITOS PARA LA CELEBRACION DE UNA MISA DE QUINCE AÑOS

1. Reunirse con la secretaria parroquial o llamarla al (818) 341-6634, ext. 1003 para hacer arreglos no antes de 5 meses de la fecha deseada.
2. Presentar una copia u original de los certificados de Bautismo y Primera Comunión.
3. Deben estar ya confirmados, en el programa de confirmación o mostrar prueba de que están registradas, ANTES DE QUE UNA FECHA PUEDA SER RESERVADA.
4. Asistir a misa regularmente.
5. La familia debe ser feligrés de la iglesia San José Obrero, ya sea porque vive dentro de los límites de nuestra parroquia, o es miembro registrado.
6. Bajo circunstancias especiales, podemos considerar familias de otras parroquias, si la fecha deseada está disponible. La cuota para los que no son feligreses es lo que su propia parroquia cobre por una misa de 15 años.

VIDA PARROQUIAL

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

LA CREMACIÓN Y LAS ENSEÑANZAS DE LA SANTA IGLESIA CATÓLICA ROMANA

Cuando un ser querido pasa a estar con el Señor, se deben tomar muchas decisiones con respecto al cuidado y sepultura del cuerpo. Mientras la mayoría de las familias optan por tener un funeral tradicional, otras prefieren la cremación para sus seres queridos. Esto es perfectamente aceptable. Parece que más familias están optando por la cremación, por lo que hay preocupaciones que deben abordarse. Espero que esto responda a la mayoría de las preguntas que recibimos sobre la cremación.

Aunque ahora se permite la cremación, no tiene el mismo valor que el entierro del cuerpo. La Iglesia claramente prefiere y exhorta a que **el cuerpo del difunto esté presente en los ritos funerarios**, ya que la presencia del cuerpo humano expresa mejor los valores que la Iglesia afirma en sus ritos. Después, el cuerpo puede ser llevado al crematorio. Si ya se ha realizado la cremación, los cremados **pueden estar presentes en la misa fúnebre**.

Los restos cremados de un cuerpo deben ser tratados con el mismo respeto dado a los restos corporales de un cuerpo humano. Esto incluye el uso de un recipiente digno para contener las cenizas, la forma en que se transportan, el cuidado y la atención a la ubicación y el transporte adecuados, y la disposición final. ¿Ahora que hacemos con los restos cremados?

Los restos cremados deben enterrarse en una tumba, en un mausoleo o columbario o incluso en el mar. La práctica de esparcir los restos cremados en el mar, desde el aire o en la tierra o mantener los restos cremados en el hogar **NO** son disposiciones reverentes que la Iglesia requiere cuando se elige la cremación. Esto incluye poner algunas de las cenizas en cápsulas para usarlas como joyería.

Si su familia opta por la cremación, tenga en cuenta estas pautas al planificar los ritos funerarios de sus seres queridos. Por supuesto, si tienen algunas preguntas, estamos aquí para ayudarles. Usted y la funeraria elegida se comunicarán con la oficina de nuestra iglesia para fijar una fecha para la misa fúnebre y el entierro de sus seres queridos. Dios los bendiga a todos, especialmente si están enfrentando esta difícil situación.

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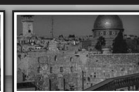
