JUSTICE WITHOUT VENGEANCE

In this Sunday Gospel we hear another passage from the Sermon on the Mound. In it, Jesus preaches a difficult message to observe: love for the enemy. A sharp contrast to the accepted law of ancient Israel at the the time, an attempt to enact fair justice based on retribution, when the judges were expected to authorize "eye for an eye" to get even. Instead, Jesus teaches justice without vengeance: loving our enemies like we love our neighbors and overcoming evil with good.




