### AUGUSTINIANS OF THE ASSUMPTION MISSION APPEAL - AUGUST 26 AND 27

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles collaborates with mission groups every year to raise funds for their missions through a program called the Missionary Cooperative Plan. The group assigned to our parish this year is the Augustinians of the Assumption. Fr. Rodel Cervantes, A.A. will be speaking to us. There will be a second collection to support them in their work.

From the very beginning, the Assumptionists have been engaged in a wide variety of apostolic works. All that advances the coming of the Reign of God has always been deemed worthy of our apostolic energy. It's a preference for poor, in response to the Gospel and to the Church calling us today to be on their side. For us too it's a consequence of our own vow to live as poor men. Some will dedicate themselves full-time to this work: with marginalized people of every kind, in hospitals and in prisons, "worker priests" or volunteers in different organizations ... But all of us try to live in union with the poor, because "the poor will always be with us", because the poor are too often neglected even within the Church. This is a bias that the Assumption encourages. Our Province of North America and the Philippines is specifically responsible for the missions in East Africa (Kenya and Tanzania), Mexico and the Philippines. We provide personnel and financial assistance that is indispensable in order to maintain our charitable works (schools and nurseries) and formation programs for both laity and clergy in these countries. Many of our apostolates in these countries specifically work to better the living conditions of the impoverished brothers and sisters we live with and minister to. In the Philippines, we sponsor education and aid programs for underprivileged villages both in the Manila area and in other mission centers. Our newly founded parish in Orizaba, Veracruz Mexico ministers to an underserved indigenous community.

#### *Assumptionist Missionary Activities*

The Venerable Emmanuel d'Alzon founded the Assumptionists in Nimes, France in 1850. He gave us as a motto "Thy Kingdom Come" to underline that "the coming of the reign of Jesus Christ for ourselves and for our neighbor is what we propose before everything else." We are to achieve this "by our complete submission, not only to the teaching of the Church, but also to the spirit of such teaching." (d'Alzon) Any work which fosters the extension of the Kingdom falls within the spirit of our works of education at the secondary and college levels, pilgrimages, ecumenism, parish ministry, missions and journalism. Bayard Press publishes in the US "Catholic Digest" and "Living with Christ." Presently we number some 900 priests and brothers working in 30 countries. We are renewing our ministry in Russia, Bulgaria, and Romania. Three Bulgarian Assumptionists, martyred by the communists in 1952, were beatified by Pope John Paul II in Plovdiv, Bulgaria on May 26, 2002. We perform specialized ministries in Greece, Turkey, Israel, and Madagascar. The African province includes the Congo, Kenya, and Tanzania. In South America we work in Colombia, Brazil, Chile, Argentina, and Ecuador. We also help staff a mission in Korea and Vietnam. In January 2006 we opened our new mission in Manila in the Philippines. Our Province of North America is specifically responsible for the missions in East Africa (Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda), Mexico and the Philippines. We provide personnel and financial assistance that is indispensable in order to maintain our charitable works (schools and nurseries) and formation programs for both laity and clergy in these countries. Many of our apostolates in these countries specifically work to better the living conditions of the impoverished brothers and sisters we live with and minister to. In the Philippines, we sponsor education and aid programs for underprivileged villages both in the Manila area and in other mission centers. Our newly founded parish in Orizaba, Veracruz Mexico ministers to an underserved indigenous community. We apply the proceeds of our Mission Appeals to the needs of our brothers in Mexico, East Africa and the Philippines.

"It's all about the behavior" is a common reminder for safe adults to be aware that abuse can happen anywhere, and to anyone. The same is true of abuse victims — there is no demographic "failsafe," such as age, race, gender, background, income, etc., that prevents a certain person from being abused. 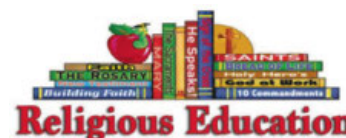

#### The Catholic Bubble

There's a dangerous myth that exists among pockets of faithful, observant Catholic families. I call it the Legend of the Catholic Bubble. Here's how the legend goes: you find a devout Catholic parish and a devout Catholic community filled with devout Catholic people who care about devout Catholic things, and you stay away from everything and everyone else, you and your children will be safe from the influence of the evil one. Your children will never fall away from the faith, or even be tempted, and your own faith will stay steel-strong amidst the many tempests and trials of this earthly life.

But like the Loch Ness Monster and the Abominable Snowman, it's all made up.

Don't misunderstand me: I love a good devout Catholic parish. I live for a supportive, devout Catholic community. It's one of the biggest blessings in the Christian life, and I cannot overstate how helpful it is to raise children in an environment that upholds your Catholic faith and does not denigrate it.

But. But.

Make no mistake: the Catholic Bubble will not save you. The trials and the temptations will find you there, too: on the parish council, at Catholic school, in your Catholic moms' group. No community on earth is so supportive that it mimics Heaven. The weeds have been sown with the good seed, and the harvest time is not yet upon us.

Cherish your community, certainly — but beware of the lure of the Catholic Bubble. We are called to be yeast in the loaf of bread, and yeast is nothing on its own.

## PROTEGIENDO A LOS NIÑOS

Todo se reduce al comportamiento

“Todo se trata del comportamiento” es un recordatorio común para que los adultos de confianza sepan que el abuso puede ocurrir en cualquier lugar y a cualquier persona. El grupo asignado a nuestra parroquia este año son los Agustinos de la Asunción. El Padre Rodel Cervantes, A.A. compartirá con nosotros, habrá una segunda colecta para apoyarlos en su trabajo.

Pero todos tratamos de vivir en unión con los pobres, porque "los pobres siempre estarán con nosotros", porque los pobres son demasiado a menudo olvidados incluso dentro de la Iglesia. Este es un sesgo que fomenta la Asunción. Nuestra Provincia de América del Norte y Filipinas es específicamente responsable de las misiones en África Oriental (Kenia y Tanzania), México y Filipinas. Brindamos asistencia personal y financiera indispensable para mantener nuestras obras de caridad (escuelas y guarderías) y programas de formación tanto para laicos como para clérigos en estos países. Muchos de nuestros apostolados en estos países trabajan específicamente para mejorar las condiciones de vida de los hermanos y hermanas empobrecidos con los que vivimos y ministramos. En Filipinas, patrocinamos programas de educación y ayuda para aldeas desfavorecidas tanto en el área de Manila como en otros centros de misión. Nuestra parroquia recién fundada en Orizaba, Veracruz México ministra a una comunidad indígena desatendida.

#### Actividades Misioneras Asuncionistas

El Venerable Emmanuel d'Alzon fundó los Asuncionistas en Nimes, Francia en 1850. Nos puso como lema “Venga Tu Reino” para subrayar que “la venida del Reino de Jesucristo para nosotros y para nuestro prójimo es lo que proponemos ante todo”. Debemos lograr esto “mediante nuestra completa sumisión, no solo a la enseñanza de la Iglesia, sino también al espíritu de tal enseñanza”. (d'Alzon) Cualquier obra que favorezca la extensión del Reino se inscribe en el espíritu de nuestras obras de educación a nivel secundario y universitario, peregrinaciones, ecumenismo, pastoral parroquial, misiones y periodismo. Bayard Press publica en los Estados Unidos “Catholic Digest” y “Living with Christ”. Actualmente somos unos 900 sacerdotes y hermanos trabajando en 30 países. Estamos renovando nuestro ministerio en Rusia, Bulgaria y Rumania. Tres Asuncionistas búlgaros, martirizados por los comunistas en 1952, fueron beatificados por el Papa Juan Pablo II en Plovdiv, Bulgaria, el 26 de mayo de 2002.
