AUGUSTINIANS OF THE ASSUMPTION MISSION APPEAL - AUGUST 26 AND 27

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles collaborates with mission groups every year to raise fund for their missions through a program called the Missionary Cooperative Plan. The group assigned to our parish this year is the Augustinians of the Assumption. Fr. Rodel Cervantes, A.A. will be speaking to us. There will be a second collection to support them in their work.

From the very beginning, the Assumptionists have been engaged in a wide variety of apostolic works. All that advances the coming of the Reign of God has always been deemed worthy of our apostolic energy. It's a preference for poor, in response to the Gospel and to the Church calling us today to be on their side. For us too it's a consequence of our own vow to live as poor men. Some will dedicate themselves full-time to this work: with marginalized people of every kind, in hospitals and in prisons, "worker priests" or volunteers in different organizations ... But all of us try to live in union with the poor, because "the poor will always be with us", because the poor are too often neglected even within the Church. This is a bias that the Assumption encourages. Our Province of North America and the Philippines is specifically responsible for the missions in East Africa (Kenya and Tanzania), Mexico and the Philippines. We provide personnel and financial assistance that is indispensable in order to maintain our charitable works (schools and nurseries) and formation programs for both laity and clergy in these countries. Many of our apostolates in these countries specifically work to better the living conditions of the impoverished brothers and sisters we live with and minister to. In the Philippines, we sponsor education and aid programs for underprivileged villages both in the Manilla area and in other mission centers. Our newly founded parish in Orizaba, Veracruz Mexico ministers to an underserved indigenous community.

Assumptionist Missionary Activities

The Venerable Emmanuel d'Alzon founded the Assumptionists in Nimes, France in 1850. He gave us as a motto "Thy Kingdom Come" to underline that "the coming of the reign of Jesus Christ for ourselves and for our neighbor is what we propose before everything else." We are to achieve this "by our complete submission, not only to the teaching of the Church, but also to the spirit of such teaching." (d'Alzon) Any work which fosters the extension of the Kingdom falls within the spirit of our works of education at the secondary and college levels, pilgrimages, ecumenism, parish ministry, missions and journalism. Bayard Press publishes in the US "Catholic Digest" and "Living with Christ." Presently we number some 900 priests and brothers working in 30 countries. We are renewing our ministry in Russia, Bulgaria, and Romania. Three Bulgarian Assumptionists, martyred by the communists in 1952, were beatified by Pope John Paul II in Plovdiv, Bulgaria on May 26, 2002. We perform specialized ministries in Greece, Turkey, Israel, and Madagascar. The African province includes the Congo, Kenya, and Tanzania. In South America we work in Colombia, Brazil, Chile, Argentina, and Ecuador. We also help staff a mission in Korea and Vietnam. In January 2006 we opened our new mission in Manila in the Philippines. Our Province of North America is specifically responsible for the missions in East Africa (Kenva, Tanzania and Uganda), Mexico and the Philippines. We provide personnel and financial assistance that is indispensable in order to maintain our charitable works (schools and nurseries) and formation programs for both laity and clergy in these countries. Many of our apostolates in these countries specifically work to better the living conditions of the impoverished brothers and sisters we live with and minister to. In the Philippines, we sponsor education and aid programs for underprivileged villages both in the Manila area and in other mission centers. Our newly founded parish in Orizaba, Veracruz Mexico ministers to an underserved indigenous community. We apply the proceeds of our Mission Appeals to the needs of our brothers in Mexico, East Africa and the Philippines.

SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

What to do if a child discloses abuse to a peer

Abuse victims often struggle to disclose what has happened to them, especially children. This struggle may be due to fear or shame, but studies show it is easier for children to disclose abuse to a trusted person. In adolescence, that is often another peer. This makes it important to educate children about what to do if a friend discloses abuse. Teach children the importance of not keeping unsafe secrets, and how to help their friends by sharing these "secrets" with a trusted parent or other adult. ¿Qué debe hacer un niño si otro menor le revela que ha sido abusado?

Las víctimas de abuso a menudo tienen dificultades para revelar lo que les ha sucedido, especialmente a otros niños. Esta lucha puede deberse a miedo o a vergüenza, pero estudios muestran que es más fácil para los niños revelar el abuso a una persona de confianza. En la adolescencia, esta persona de confianza suele ser una persona de su misma edad. Esto conduce a la importancia de educar a los niños sobre qué hacer si un amigo le revela que ha sido abusado. Enséñele a los niños la importancia de no guardar secretos de inseguridad, y cómo ayudar a sus amigos compartiendo estos "secretos" con un padre de familia de confianza o con otro adulto de confianza. VIDA PARROQUIAL

AGUSTINOS DE LA ASUNCIÓN PLAN COOPERATIVO MISIONERO 27 DE AGOSTO

El grupo asignado a nuestra parroquia este año son los Agustinos de la Asunción. El Padre Rodel Cervantes, A.A. compartira con nosotros, habrá una segunda colecta para apoyarlos en su trabajo.

Desde el principio, los Asuncionistas se han comprometido en una amplia variedad de trabajos apostólicos. Todo lo que adelanta la venida del Reino de Dios siempre ha sido considerado digno de nuestra energía apostólica. Es una preferencia por los pobres, en respuesta al Evangelio ya la Iglesia que hoy nos llama a estar de su lado. También para nosotros es una consecuencia de nuestro propio voto de vivir como hombres pobres. Algunos se dedicarán a tiempo completo a este trabajo: con personas marginadas de todo tipo, en hospitales y en prisiones, "sacerdotes trabajadores" o voluntarios en diferentes organizaciones... Pero todos tratamos de vivir en unión con los pobres, porque "los pobres siempre estarán con nosotros", porque los pobres son demasiado a menudo olvidados incluso dentro de la Iglesia. REQUESTING USE OF PARISH FACILITIES


