On October 7, the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, a day steeped in history that goes back to 1571 when Pope Pius V instituted the feast of Our Lady of Victory to mark a victory against the Turkish armada, which he attributed to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

In 1573, Pope Gregory XIII changed the name of the feast to Feast of the Holy Rosary, to be celebrated on the first Sunday of October. In 1913, Pius X changed the date to October 7, the day it is celebrated today.

The practice of praying the rosary has a long history. Pope Leo XIII was particularly devoted to Our Lady of the Rosary and wrote 11 encyclicals on the subject of the feast and its importance. In the first, *Supremi Apostolatus Officio*, written in 1883, he noted that, "It has always been the habit of Catholics in danger and in troublous times to fly for refuge to Mary."

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

October 8, 2023 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus' parables are much stranger than most people realize. This week is an attention-getting example. He tells the religious leaders a parable about a completely absurd situation. Blood-thirsty and insane tenants violently abuse and kill the servants of their landlord. Inexplicably, the owner keeps sending them more victims of increasing value — up to and including his own son. Weird.

Usually, we hear this parable and assume it's an allegory: Jesus is the murdered son, the servants the prophets, etc. Fair enough. But notice - and here is where the weirdness deepens — Jesus seems to disagree with the Pharisees' interpretation that the landowner should and will punish the inheritance-obsessed murderers. So, is Jesus praising the psychotic and greedy murderers?! You can imagine the furrowed brows and deriding laughter as the scoffing crowd shuffles away.

If we stay with this tough parable, perhaps this truth emerges: God wants us to have an over-the-top obsession with a totally undeserved inheritance. Of course, we are forbidden to use violence. But the parable's violence gets our attention because it highlights the crazy goodness of the landowner. Jesus reveals that God is not merely in the business of rewarding the good and punishing the bad. He is playing a much stranger game — one marked by a kind of over-the-top mercy, a breathtaking giving of what is not deserved. What would our week look like if we embraced this kind of desire for God's kingdom on earth, even if others think we're nuts? This week let's seek God's kingdom with a passionate confidence in God's desire to give the good things we don't deserve.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

You know how the story goes. Your son or daughter swears that while you were gone he or she only invited two friends over to watch a movie and eat popcorn. How those other twenty-five people got there with beer is still a mystery. They were not invited but your young host felt pretty uncomfortable just kicking them out. You did teach them about good hospitality after all.

That sure is a twisted view of hospitality, perhaps, but it does make me reflect on those I am willing to welcome into my home and those I am not. Who is my neighbor? Would I extend hospitality to the person that is alone? I have done so for holidays. But I have known them well. Would I invite someone into my home that I did not know? It could be unsafe. But what if I found myself alone somewhere without any connections. Where would I turn? Who could I trust?

There are no simple answers here but I wonder if we should really have the luxury of not asking the question. If the Christian will not invite in the lost and forsaken, who will? In the coming days, I suggest we all reflect on those in our midst who seem to be alone. Who can we invite into our lives who need something much more important than a party? Who is out there who simply need friends? They may not need a physical shelter but they do need the warmth of Christian hospitality and the kindness of others.



8 de octubre de 2023 27º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

En este domingo, damos gracias a Dios por su fidelidad y paciencia para con nosotros. Hoy, el Evangelio habla de la viña y de los frutos que hemos dado. Estamos aquí para rendir al máximo, en beneficio de los más necesitados. Hoy, la invitación es de renovar los valores y la convicción del cómo trabajamos individualmente y en equipo. Con el fin único de gozar de los frutos que todos producimos. Ese es el ideal y la meta de Jesús para su Reino. El profeta Isaías explica la viña de la siguiente manera: "¿Qué otra cosa pude hacer a mi viña que no se lo hice? ¿Por qué, esperando que diera uvas, sólo ha dado racimos amargos? Es decir, trabajo haciendo el bien por los demás o voy a la contraria a la par de la injusticia.

"En cada época, los que tienen autoridad, cualquier autoridad, incluso en la Iglesia, en el pueblo de Dios pueden sentir la tentación de seguir su propio interés en lugar del de Dios. Y Jesús dice que la verdadera autoridad se cumple cuando se presta servicio, está en servir, no en explotar a los demás. La viña es del Señor, no nuestra. La autoridad es un servicio, y como tal debe ser ejercida, para el bien de todos y para difusión del Evangelio. Es muy feo cuando en la Iglesia se ve a las personas que tienen autoridad buscan el propio interés". (Papa Francisco 10/4/2020). Y no solo en la Iglesia, también en la familia, es horrible cuando papá o mamá ejercen su liderazgo con injusticia. La lección es para todos. ¡Gracias, Jesús, por tu amor!
