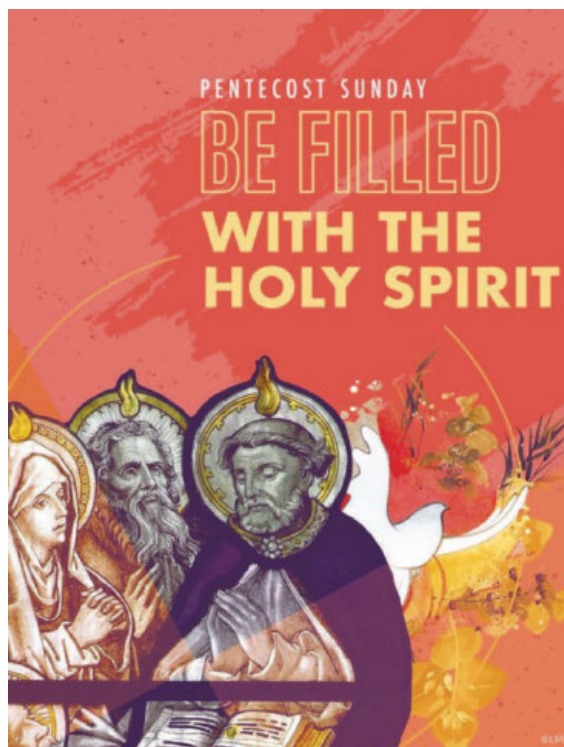

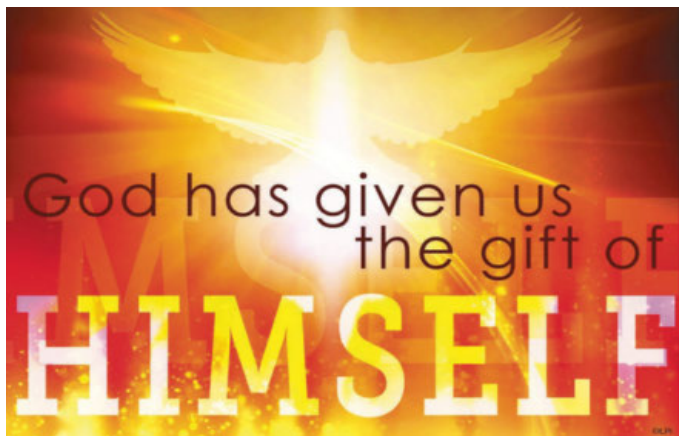


CHARISMATIC PRAYER GROUP

SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

“Myth-busting” abduction statistics

New sources hyperfocus on abductions by strangers, generating fear and anxiety that these abductions happen often and everywhere. According to data from the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, however, about 100 children per year are abducted by strangers nationwide. It is far, far more likely that a missing child ran away from home or was enticed to leave home by someone he knows or trusts. More than 80% of missing children reported to NCMEC have left home under their own power, even if their decision to leave was coerced. EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

You Don't Have What It Takes — but You Will

Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called.

We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we're supposed to do, in any situation. It's that feeling of: Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can't.

We've all got our list of reasons why not, don't we? We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I'm not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don't want to come across as pushy. I'm not going to make amends with my cousin because she'll just walk all over me again. I'm not going to say a Rosary tonight because I'm tired and it'll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of "reasons why we can't" together, I don't think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles. Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven't been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages. Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades?

But even that big, giant, stop-you-dead-in-your tracks Reason Why We Can't was nothing, because God had a plan. He didn't call a bunch of equipped men. He called them, and He equipped them. Cue the tongues of fire!

God doesn't call us to do His will because we have what it takes. He calls us because He's ready to give us what it takes. Being a good steward is to answer the call of Christ knowing he will provide.

PROTEGIENDO A LOS NIÑOS

Estadísticas de secuestros que "rompen mitos"

Las fuentes de noticias se centran sobremedida en los secuestros por parte de extraños, lo que genera miedo y ansiedad de que estos secuestros ocurran con frecuencia y en todas partes. Sin embargo, según datos del Centro Nacional de Niños Desaparecidos y Explotados (NCMEC, por sus siglas en inglés), unos 100 niños al año son secuestrados por extraños en todo el país. Es mucho más probable que un niño desaparecido se haya escapado de su hogar o haya sido inducido a abandonar su hogar por alguien que conoce o en quien confía. Más del 80 por ciento de los niños desaparecidos denunciados ante el NCMEC han abandonado sus hogares por sus propios medios, aun cuando su decisión para huir haya sido bajo cohesión.
