In one way or another, much of Father Memo’s willingness/desire to be of service for our Church derived from the positive impact of various priest mentors and Lasallian brothers throughout the course of his life. Before embarking on the priestly discernment program with our Archdiocese, Father Memo studied and played football at Cathedral High School in Los Angeles. While studying for his Master’s in Divinity at Saint John’s, Father Memo in 2019 also obtained a Master’s of Science in Organizational Leadership from National University in La Jolla. At the age of twenty-six, Father Memo was ordained a priest by Archbishop José Horacio Gómez on Saturday 04 June 2022. Father Memo’s first parish assignment as an Associate Pastor was at Saint Genevieve in Panorama City. On a personal note, Father Memo is a fan of LA sports teams and enjoys driving through the Pacific Coast Highway while listening to instrumental music and even stopping along the way to appreciate the beauty of God’s gift of nature for us. As Father Memo now begins his second parish assignment as our Associate Pastor, he asks that we pray for him and all the ministers of our Church.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 15, 2024

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This morning I received a text message that a member of my extended family will likely die of cancer within the next few hours. His name is Luke. He is a 45-year-old husband and father of six. Though I am not as close to him as my sister (she is his sister-in-law and knows him well), I wonder: how can we, including Luke himself, manage such a terribly awful and unfair situation?

The words of this Sunday’s Gospel offer a powerful and challenging path. Jesus says, **“If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me”** (Mark 8:34). Today I see with new freshness the starkness and strangeness of the words **take up**. The cross stands for suffering which is unjust, absurd, seemingly hopeless, and humiliating. Jesus doesn’t say “accept” or “endure” or “tolerate,” but “take up.” Embrace it, actively. Choose it and lift it up for others to see what terrifies and sickens us. But somehow, for Jesus, this is the path to **“saving one’s life.”** A new world is breaking in, one in which love is everything, when no relationship can be wounded or die. I trust that in the embraced suffering of Luke and his loved ones, Jesus is taking up his cross and saving us all. By the time you read this, barring a miracle, Luke will have died. He will be carrying his cross no longer. But we all still face suffering. This week let’s not just endure, but take up our crosses, big and small. That’s our only hope for saving our lives.

St. Joseph the Worker Memorial Society is intended as a meaningful and beautiful way for persons to remember their beloved deceased or to express their condolences to friends who have lost a loved one. Persons enrolled in the Memorial Society will share in the spiritual benefits of special Masses and prayers offered throughout the year, every year. A Mass is offered for those enrolled every first Saturday of the month at our 8:30 a.m. Mass. The enrollment list is kept in the Parish Center and is accessible during office hours. Each memorial is presented in a handsome leatherette folder, containing an enrollment card where the name of the person remembered is inscribed, along with the person who enrolled the deceased. The leatherette folder with personalized enrollment card is particularly suitable on the occasion of a death, to bring to a viewing or funeral, or to send as an anniversary remembrance. If your child is using a tablet, iPad, or phone for school this year, you need to be aware of what they can access online. While many school devices may have safety controls in place, children are pretty creative, and may be able to maneuver around these safeguards. Consider making a “tech space” in your home, where all devices live when they are not in use — and make it centrally located, so you know whenever someone takes a device. Consider also having your children use their devices in the main area of the house, with supervision. BIENVENIDOS PADRE MEMO

El Padre Guillermo “Memo” Alonso nació en el Este de Los Ángeles y creció en Boyle Heights. Unas de las razones por la cual el Padre Memo tiene un aprecio y familiaridad con los hispanos es porque él fue el menor de cinco hijos quienes fueron criados por dos padres amorosos de México. De una manera e otra, el deseo y disposición de estar al servicio de nuestra Iglesia derivó del impacto positivo a lo largo de su vida de varios sacerdotes mentores y hermanos Lasallistas. Antes de comenzar el programa de la formación sacerdotal con nuestra arquidiócesis, el Padre Memo estudió y jugó el fútbol americano en la preparatoria catedral en Los Ángeles. Durante el transcurso de sus estudios en el Seminario de San Juan en Camarillo para su Maestría de Divinidad, el Padre Memo también obtuvo una Maestría de Ciencias en Liderazgo Organizacional en el 2019 de la Universidad Nacional en La Jolla. A la edad de veintiséis años, el Padre Memo fue ordenado sacerdote el sábado 04 de junio del 2022 por la imposición de manos de nuestro Monseñor José Horacio Gómez.
