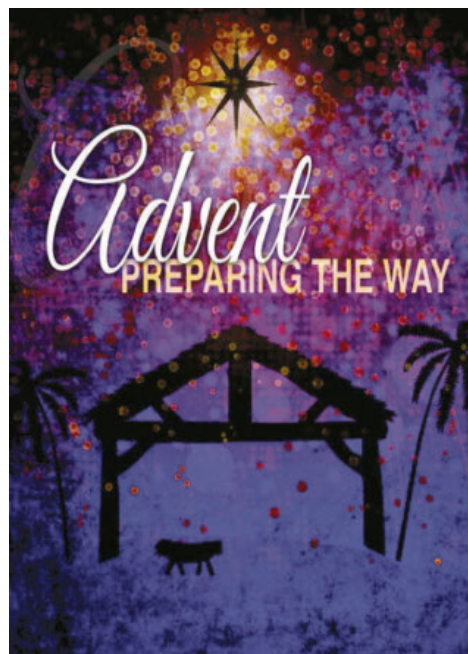
We are asking your assistance with our decorations:

CHRISTMAS TOY DRIVE



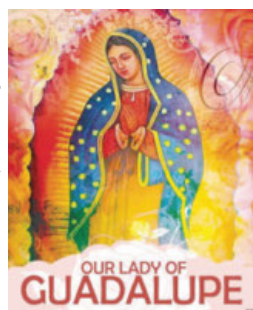

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Tuesday, December 12, all of the Americas will be celebrating the feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe. She has been titled Empress of the Americas, Spain, and the Philippines and Queen of Mexico. This devotion began in 1531, shortly after the Spanish conquest of the Aztec people by Cortez. Early on the morning of December 9, the Indian peasant Juan Diego was en route to Mass when Mary appeared to him. Mary requested that a church be built there "so that in it I can show and send forth all my love, compassion, help and defense." Juan Diego brought the message to Bishop Zumárraga who was skeptical and demanded a sign from heaven. Mary again appeared to Juan Diego telling him where to find fresh flowers to show to the bishop. The young Aztec Christian gathered fresh roses from the frozen ground and cradled them in his rough tilma (cloak) as he returned to the Bishop. Bishop Zumárraga fell to his knees in amazement, not at the sight of a rose in winter, but at the image of the Virgin Mary fixed into the fibers of Juan Diego's tilma. In the astrological beliefs so central to Aztec culture, the sun god and the gods of moon and stars waged a daily battle of light and darkness. Mary's image eclipses the sun whose rays can still be seen. Standing upon the moon, with stars decorating her mantle, she is depicted as greater than, though not destroying, the Indian gods. Mary speaks to Juan Diego in his native language. She has the features and complexion of an Aztec maiden. After the bloody conquest of 1521, the Indians of Mexico were slow to respond to any missionary efforts. Christianity was closely associated with conquest. Just seven years after the apparitions at Tepeyac, however, an estimated four to six million became Christians. Amidst great suffering, the people were consoled by Mary's simple message: "I want to protect you. I want to right the wrongs." In the ensuing four hundred years people have continued to turn to the Virgin of Guadalupe with devotion and confidence in their moments of trial. Mary still looks compassionately upon the poor and renews her promise: **"I will hear your lamentations and remedy your miseries, pains and sufferings. Be not afraid, am I not here, am I not your mother?"**

SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN

Child pornography and artificial intelligence, part 2

Artificial intelligence, or AI, has opened the door to generating incredibly realistic images. Often called “deepfakes,” we have seen these images crop up on social media. In January 2024, explicit images of Taylor Swift, created by AI, were posted online, and viewed over 45 million times before they were removed. In the same way, AI technology can be used by child abusers to create and share explicit imagery. Vehicle Access for St. Joseph the Worker Church

ACCESS MAP

CicLAvia-The Valley is taking place on Sunday, December 8 from 9am to 3pm. Streets will be closed to cars and open for the community to bike, run, walk, skate, stroller, and play. This event is free, family-friendly, and open to the public.

The CicLAvia route will be closed to car traffic from approximately 7am to 5pm. There will be no parking on the route from 1am to 5pm that day.

Cars will be able to cross the route at several major intersections, including Sherman Way/Winnetka. See CicLAvia Route Map for details.

St. Joseph the Worker's driveway on Sherman Way will be blocked and inaccessible for the duration of the street closure (7am to 5pm). Churchgoers should use the rear driveway on Cantlay St that day.

For those traveling from the south, note that vehicles are permitted to cross Sherman Way at Winnetka Ave. Use Winnetka Ave > Valerio St > Oakdale St > Cantlay St.

For those traveling from the north, use Winnetka Ave > Valerio St > Oakdale St > Cantlay St or Corbin Ave > Valerio St > Quartz St > Cantlay St.

Please note: There may be Road Closed barricade signs near the route; please act in traffic safety or other ways through. There may be additional closures along the event route. Plan accordingly and allow additional time to arrive.

La inteligencia artificial, o IA, ha abierto la puerta a la generación de imágenes increíblemente realistas. A menudo llamadas “deepfakes”, hemos visto aparecer estas imágenes en las redes sociales. En enero de 2024, se publicaron en línea imágenes explícitas de Taylor Swift, creadas por IA, y fueron vistas más de 45 millones de veces antes de que se eliminaran. De la misma manera, los abusadores de menores pueden usar la tecnología de IA para crear y compartir imágenes explícitas.
