

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 15, 2024 3rd Sunday of Advent

On a bright Spring morning, a passerby once saw St. Francis of Assisi hoeing a row of beans and asked him, "What would you be doing right now if you knew this was the last day of your earthly life?" The Saint responded, "I'd keep hoeing this row of beans." Preparing for this world to end — whether by our death or by Jesus' glorious coming — invites us to live not in the past or the present, but deeply in the present moment.

This same point is on display in the simple advice given by the wild and eccentric John the Baptist. He speaks of the one who is to come who will baptize "with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16). Despite the bizarre awesomeness of this announcement, he tells his listeners to engage in the present moment with simple acts of justice and love as their preparation for Jesus' coming, sharing their clothes and food, eliminating greedy and underhanded practices, being content with their wages. It's so undramatic. But how many actually did it? We don't know. How many of us will commit ourselves to these types of humble and demanding practices in our lives? That's what we should be doing now in our present moment, not worrying about the future.

Advent challenge: Name one way you are doing the bare minimum towards others in your daily life. Or name something you are doing because you are not content with your financial situation. Pray: "Jesus, if it is your will, help me to stop doing these things this week. Help me prepare for your coming." Then make the appropriate changes.



EDUCATION/FAITH FORMATION

SCHOOL STUDENT SERVICE PROJECTS

This year, our students are having the opportunity to participate in three different service projects.

First, students are receiving a Missionary Childhood Association collection box. By collecting their spare change (or putting in some money that they have earned), students can help other children in impoverished areas of our world. As Jesus said in the Gospel of Matthew, "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Continuing with this idea of helping others, each class will have a "Reverse Advent Calendar." The idea for this is to bring in one item per day (like an Advent calendar) to help support our parish community's St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. Students are to bring unopened, unexpired food items.

Finally, each class will be choosing a gift tag for a child in their age range from the "giving tree" in the church. We are asking each student to bring in \$1 of their own money (perhaps earned by doing a chore around the house) to buy an item from the tag their class chooses. Teachers will then "shop" with the class to choose a gift.

"No" is a complete sentence.

A critical boundary to learn for yourself and for your children is the word "no." Saying "no" to something you are uncomfortable with, or that you know is wrong, is sometimes the hardest thing to do, but it is so important. "No" is a complete sentence and should be honored by anyone listening. This is a great way to teach children how to listen to their friends and respect what they hear. This teaches children personal autonomy, which can extend to a child saying "no" to unwanted touches or behavior and potentially protect them from abuse and harm. 

El tercer domingo de Adviento es conocido como Gaudete, una palabra en latín que significa "gozo", y se basa en la Carta de San Pablo a los Filipenses: "Estén siempre alegres en el Señor; se lo repito, estén alegres y tengan buen trato con todos" (Filipenses 4:4). Estas palabras resumen prácticamente lo que estamos viviendo cada día que pasa y nos acerca al nacimiento de nuestros Salvador. La alegría aumenta en nuestros corazones y nos impulsa a estar más preparados en dos aspectos importantes. Espiritualmente y en la preparación de la fiesta en casa para el día de Navidad. ¿Qué pensamos hacer? ¿A cuál Eucaristía asistiremos en familia para agradecer a Jesús su bondad y misericordia?

María y Juan Bautista nos muestran el camino. Nos indican que somos llamados a dar testimonio de la luz, a ser valientes, a sabernos retirar a tiempo para señalarle y otros lo vean y lo sigan. "Yo los bautizo con agua, pero está por llegar uno con más poder que yo, y yo no soy digno de desatar las correas de su sandalia. Él los bautizará con el Espíritu Santo y el fuego. Tiene la pala en sus manos para separar el trigo de la paja. Guardará el trigo en sus graneros, mientras que la paja la quemará en el fuego que no se apaga" (Lucas 3:16-17). Aquí está la clave de hoy, ¿somos trigo o somos paja? ¿Dónde nos colocará el Señor? Pues, la respuesta es solamente tuya. Aún estamos a tiempo de enderezar lo torcido de nuestra vida. Ven, Señor, ¡no tardes en llegar!
